From the Desk of the Pastor

The Significance of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

As I write this, we are celebrating the Holy Day of the Solemnity of the Assumption the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven. This is such a significant day for the whole church but also for us individually. We celebrate the Blessed Virgin Mary going home to God, being assumed body and soul into heaven so that she could be at home with her Son, the very source of all life and love. She was given this particular grace by God because of her cooperation with God and the special role she was given in bearing the savior of the world. If we often associate our earthly home with the feeling of being surrounded by love, how much more does "the home" of heaven hold out promise, joy, hope and love for us all. So, this great feast reminds us of our true home and hopefully to live our lives on earth in a way that always follows the example of Mary's wholehearted yes to God.

Pope Benedict offered these reflections in a homily given on the significance of this great feast a number of years ago:

But now let us ask ourselves: how does the Assumption of Mary help our journey? The first answer is: in the Assumption we see that in God there is room for man, God himself is the house with many rooms of which Jesus speaks (cf. Jn 14:2); God is man's home, in God there is God's space. And Mary, by uniting herself, united to God, does not distance herself from us. She does not go to an unknown galaxy, but whoever approaches God comes closer, for God is close to us all; and Mary, united to God, shares in the presence of God, is so close to us, to each one of us.

There is a beautiful passage from St Gregory the Great on St Benedict that we can apply to Mary too. St Gregory the Great says that the heart of St Benedict expanded so much that all creation could enter it. This is even truer of Mary: Mary, totally united to God, has a heart so big that all creation can enter this heart, and the ex-votos in every part of the earth show it. Mary is close, she can hear us, she can help us, she is close to everyone of us. In God there is room for man and God is close, and Mary, united to God, is very close; she has a heart as great as the heart of God.



But there is also another aspect: in God not only is there room for man; in man there is room for God. This too we see in Mary, the Holy Ark who bears the presence of God. In us there is space for God and this presence of God in us, so important for bringing light to the world with all its sadness, with its problems. This presence is realized in the faith: in the faith we open the doors of our

existence so that God may enter us, so that God can be the power that gives life and a path to our existence. In us there is room, let us open ourselves like Mary opened herself, saying: "Let your will be done, I am the servant of the Lord". By opening ourselves to God, we lose nothing. On the contrary, our life becomes rich and great.

And so, faith and hope and love are combined. Today there is much discussion on a better world to be awaited: it would be our hope. If and when this better world comes, we do not know, I do not know. What is certain is that a world which distances itself from God does not become better but worse. Only God's presence can guarantee a good world. Let us leave it at that.

One thing, one hope is certain: God expects us, waits for us, we do not go out into a void, we are expected. God is expecting us and on going to that other world we find the goodness of the Mother, we find our loved ones, we find eternal Love. God is waiting for us: this is our great joy and the great hope that is born from this Feast. Mary visits us, and she is the joy of our life and joy is hope. -POPE BENEDICT

May Mary's total fidelity to her son help us to listen to him, to follow in his way, and to attain a place in heaven with him.

Save the Date: Sept. 7, 2025 Our Lady of Velankani Feast Day Celebration



Join us for a multi-cultural celebration on Sunday, September 7 starting at 10:30AM, to honor our Blessed Mother and celebrate the feast day with a Procession, Holy Rosary, Mass (11AM), and Lunch Reception.

Christianity has thrived in India since Saint Thomas the Apostle arrived in 52 A.D. In the 16th century, the Blessed Mother Mary appeared three times in Velankani, a coastal village in southern India, sparking hundreds of reported miracles.

For over 400 years, the annual feast on September 8th has drawn nearly 3 million pilgrims. The celebrations begin with flag hoisting, followed by nine days of novena, and culminate in a procession of Our Lady of Velankani's statue. On November 3, 1962, Pope John XXIII elevated the shrine to Basilica status, calling it the "Lourdes of the East." Today, Velankani remains one of India's most visited religious sites, where Hindus, Muslims, and Christians worship together—a powerful symbol of faith, unity, and healing.

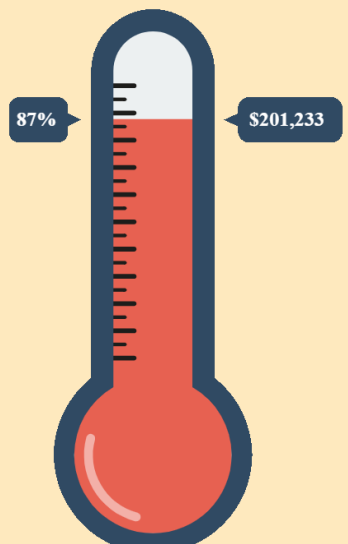

MINISTRY NEWS

St Vincent de Paul: Small Miracles July 2025 Update



In our SVDP ministry, our help often begins with a request for assistance and a home visit. Recently our team received a request from a young mother for help with rent, food and utilities. Our neighbor in need had just moved into housing after months in a shelter, escaping domestic violence with her two young children. Though she now had a roof over her head, safety still felt fragile, and the weight of starting over was heavy.

We listened.

Our neighbor in need shared her story with quiet strength. Her son, who is autistic, was homeschooled because of all the overwhelming transitions in his young life. Her daughter, who is younger and full of imagination, was trying to make sense of the changes around her and acting out. Rent was due, the fridge was nearly empty, and the apartment still echoed with the absence of furniture. We were able to help with rent, food, beds, bedding and a table and chairs assisting them to make a new start. But before we left, we asked, "is there anything else - something small-that would make life a little easier?"

Our neighbor hesitated, then smiled gently. "My daughter...she keeps talking about a play kitchen. There was one at one of the shelters we stayed in. She loved it but hardly got to play in it because the bigger children pushed her away. She wishes she could have one of her own."

Her daughter made her own specific request after hearing her mom tell us about the play kitchen. "I want a pink one, please!"

After lots of searching, prayers and dead ends a miracle happened. We found one—a PINK kitchenette, just her size. Not just a toy, but a symbol of stability, joy and the beginning of healing. When it arrived, her daughter squealed with delight and immediately began cooking and making us tea and snacks. In that moment, their new apartment felt a lot more like home.

A few days later, we received a note from our neighbor thanking us for making a difference.

"Your SVdP team has not just made a small difference in our lives but a HUGE difference. You offered warmth and acceptance and love in a way my children and I have never received before. In addition, the things you brought us were small in comparison to the biggest gift you gave us: your presence. In just your presence I am more healed and more confident for it.

My kids have seen what true kindness and love should look like from others and that's a gift I have no words for, nor can ever repay. You perhaps were angels in your own right; you are beautiful and definitely doing God's work and that is something I have truly never witnessed before.

All the items your group provided for us are invaluable to our new start. But the true gift of healing came in the form of a pink wooden play kitchenette with play food and dishes. My daughter has been so excited and tells me 'It's my kitchen and I can play without others hitting and pushing me.'

That is a huge gift, because I know my daughter is healing and starting to feel safe and truly at home as is her big brother. As a mother it made me weep inside for joy because my kids are honestly starting to feel what it means to have a home that's ours and is truly safe. So my gratitude is deep and layered and vast. Thank you for helping us."

That's what our ministry is about. Not just meeting needs, but meeting people—right where they are. Whether it's a tank of gas, a warm meal, or a listening ear, we believe the small acts of kindness can ripple into lasting change. We strive to meet not just the urgent needs, but to listen for the quiet wishes that can bring light into dark places.

Thanks to everyone who supports our ministry work. Whether it is through your monetary donations, needed items left in the basket in the Narthex, gift cards at Christmas or through your prayers, your generosity helps us be the hands and feet of Christ in our neighborhood, one encounter at a time.

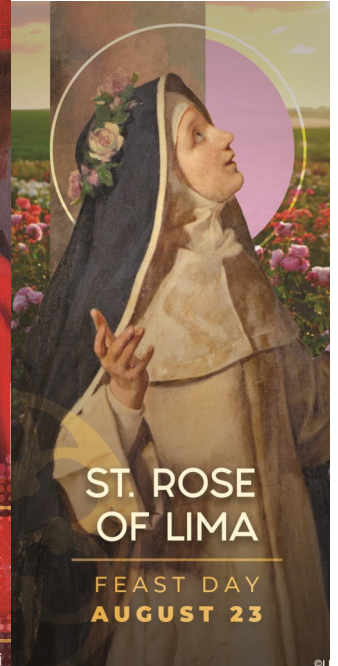

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity. A QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, which is unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. QCDs don't require that you itemize, which due to recent tax law changes, means you may decide to take advantage of the higher standard deduction but still use a QCD for charitable giving.

IRA DISTRIBUTIONS (RMD)

By utilizing an IRA for charitable giving, you can satisfy your required minimum distribution (RMD) obligations starting at age 73, while also supporting a cause you care about. The donated amount is excluded from your taxable income, which can provide a tax advantage, especially if you do not itemize deductions.
