Dear friends in Christ,

LET US SHARE THE FAITH!

Faith is a great gift. We know our relationship with the Lord, our Catholic faith, our Church, and our parish, has nourished and enriched our lives and helped amid joys and sorrows. Faith in Jesus Christ sustains us in so many ways. Our faith, and our relationship with Jesus, who has so convincingly demonstrated the Love of God, shouldn't be hidden! Our faith is meant to be shared. It is good news! The best news!

Jesus never ceased to invite others to follow him. Sometimes his invitations were ignored, sometimes accepted, and sometimes, even many times, vehemently rejected. But Jesus never stopped proposing the Gospel and inviting people to follow him. Jesus, entrusted this same mission, that of announcing the Good News of the kingdom, to the Apostles and to all of us, his disciples. We ought not to expect any better treatment than he got, but ought to have the same persistence and zeal to share what we have received.

WHO DO WE KNOW THAT MIGHT WANT TO BECOME CATHOLIC?

I want to encourage each of us to think of the circles in which we run in; the people we encounter, our family, our friends, acquaintances, coworkers, associates. Who is in need of Jesus? Who is in need of this new way of living, this new way of seeing the world, a relationship with the Lord, Christ's presence, mercy, grace in their lives? Then pray specifically for those persons. Ask God's help to be a witness, an instrument of God's grace, a proclaimer of God's word in their lives. Finally ask the Holy Spirit to guide you, to place his word in your mouth to show you the way to approach and invite them. The Holy Spirit might encourage you to share a word of encouragement, to share a word of scriptures, to share about what happens at our parish, to share a story of your life of faith, to share an article on Catholicism, or invite you to deeper prayer or conversion yourself. Then act on those promptings of the Holy Spirit.

BECOMING CATHOLIC SESSIONS ARE BEGINNING

Very soon, the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, the process by which adults are formed to become Catholic, to receive the sacraments, and become full members of the Catholic Church is beginning soon. It starts with a period of inquiry and exploration of the faith, of each person's faith journey, and the questions people may have. If you know of someone

who has been thinking about becoming Catholic and or simply might like to learn more, let them know about OCIA and invite them to contact DEACON REUBEN D'SA at St. Jude (reuben@stjude-redmond.org), or for Holy Innocents and St Anthony contact DEBBY WEIDNER, through the parish office. Consider offering to be their sponsor or to come with them to OCIA.

LET US PASS ON THE FAITH—TO THE NEXT GENERATIONS

Just as important is passing on the faith to the next generations. Starting soon in September are our Faith Formation and Sacramental Preparation programs for children and youth. At the heart of all of these efforts is facilitating an encounter with Jesus Christ, Savior and Lord, the wellspring of love, joy and hope. All of our programs are aimed at supporting parents as the first and best teachers of the faith.

At St. Jude, we have a wonderful K-6 program on Tuesday nights. Be also sure to sign up your 2nd graders for preparation for First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. If you have a 7th grader or up, this is the usual age range for Confirmation. Please be sure to register 7th Graders, 8th Graders and any High School to prepare for this wonderful sacrament of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. We also have wonderful Teen Groups forming to help our youth grow in their faith.

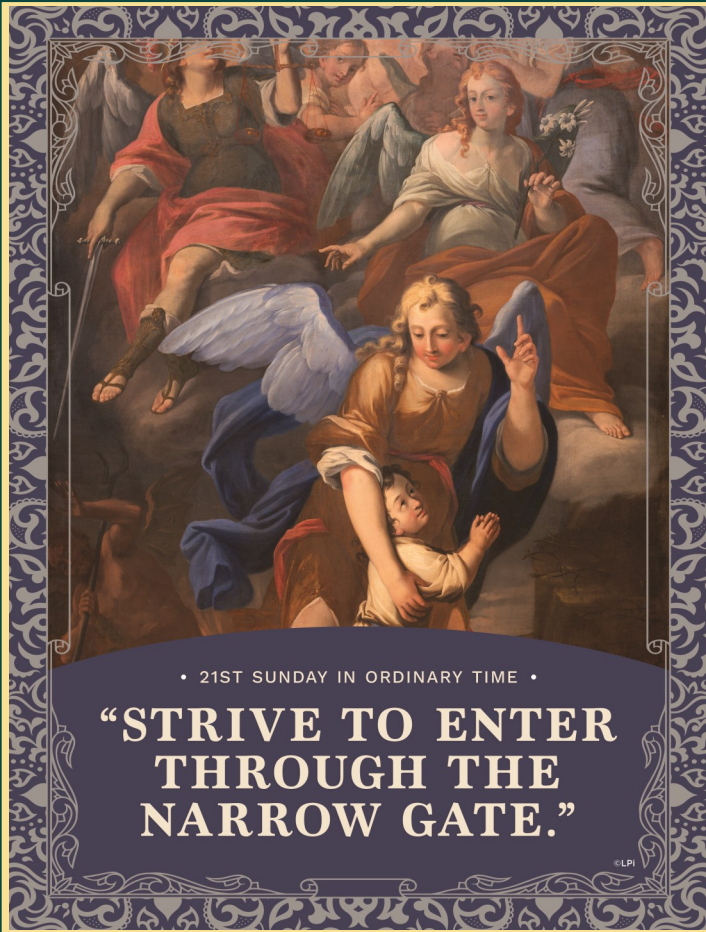

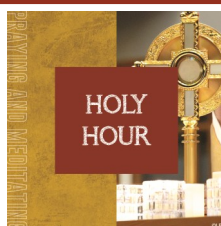


Closed For Labor Day

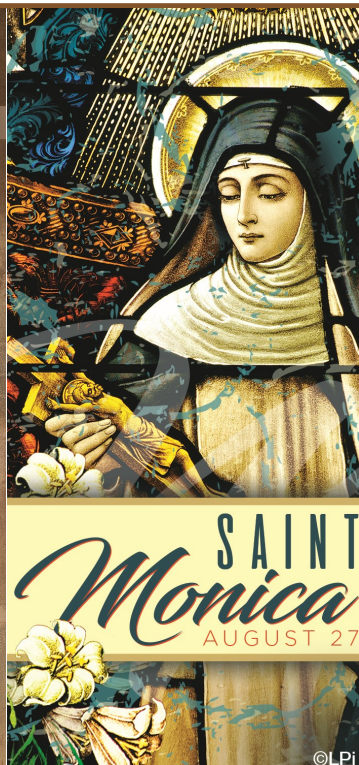
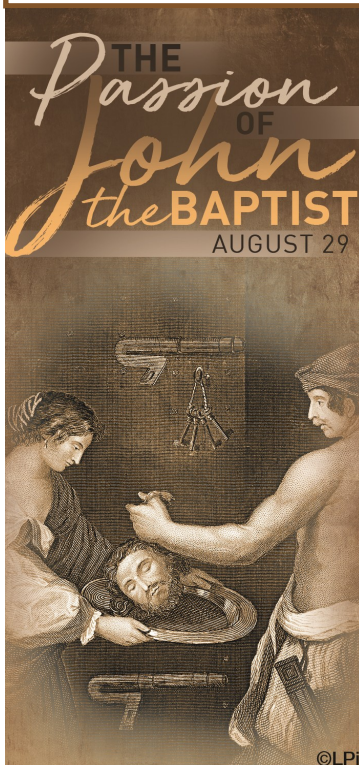

Refugee Ministry Update - July 2025

Dear Friends,

As part of our ongoing commitment to living the Gospel through action, St. Jude's Refugee Ministry continues to support Ukrainian families displaced by the brutal war in the region. Thanks to your generosity, we've helped provide housing, food, transportation, and emotional support to those rebuilding their lives in our community. Our dedicated volunteers have offered rides, assisted with job opportunities, delivered essential goods, and shared meals that remind these families they are not alone. I wanted to take a moment to share some updates on the families we've been walking alongside:

Yemelianova family:

Yulia and her two children moved to Switzerland early last year to be closer to her husband and extended family. She recently sent an update that I'd like to share: Good afternoon, Vinod, glad to hear from you! We are doing well. We recently visited our Ukrainian friends in Vienna, and just yesterday I returned to Switzerland.



The children are on vacation now, and school starts soon.

Yesenia, in 0th grade, has learned a little French. Leonty is shy about speaking but understands a lot! He'll begin weekly hockey training in September.

Things in Ukraine are very bad, especially in our city (Kherson). We lack weapons, and the city has been heavily destroyed. My husband's parents' house was destroyed, but thankfully my dad and other relatives are alive. It's very hard for them, though he tries not to show it. We try not to dwell on the bad and focus on hope—it gives us strength. I'm so grateful I had the chance to meet all of you. We always remember you with warmth. Your kindness and support will never be forgotten. Please say hello to your family and everyone who knows me."



Raynko Family

With the help of our volunteers, the Raynko family recently moved into a new apartment in Woodinville. We continue to assist with monthly rent payments and have provided furniture and other essentials. Geanna, the father, works full-time and supplements his income with handyman jobs. He's obtained a business license and takes on small projects like landscaping, painting, concrete, home repairs and fence building.

Koldych Family

Maryna and her three teenage children live in Redmond and are adjusting well. Maryna works full-time on the night shift to support her family. The children have learned English and adapted beautifully. Maryna continues to face serious dental challenges and requires full-mouth orthodontic work. We've supported her first phase of treatment with \$7,000 for upper implants.

We are deeply grateful for your prayers, donations, and time. Every act of kindness brings hope as these families continue to resettle and find stability and peace. Let us remain a parish of compassion and courage.

FEAST OF OUR LADY OF VELANKANNI

Save the Date: September 7, 2025 Lady of Velankanni Feast Day Celebration

Christianity has thrived in India since Saint Thomas the Apostle arrived in 52 A.D. In the 16th century, the Blessed Mother Mary appeared three times in Velankanni, a coastal village in southern India, sparking hundreds of reported miracles.

For over 400 years, the annual feast on September 8th has drawn nearly 3 million pilgrims. The celebrations begin with flag hoisting, followed by nine days of novena, and culminate in a procession of Our Lady of Velankanni's statue.

On November 3, 1962, Pope John XXIII elevated the shrine to Basilica status, calling it the "Lourdes of the East." Today,

Velankanni remains one of India's most visited religious sites, where Hindus, Muslims, and Christians worship together—a powerful symbol of faith, unity, and healing.

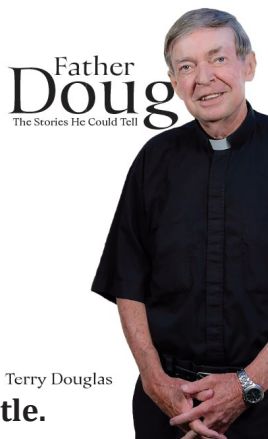

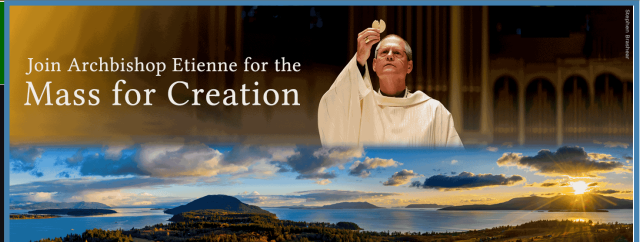

Ways to Give

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity. A QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, which is unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. QCDs don't require that you itemize, which due to recent tax law changes, means you may decide to take advantage of the higher standard deduction but still use a QCD for charitable giving.

IRA DISTRIBUTIONS (RMD)

By utilizing an IRA for charitable giving, you can satisfy your required minimum distribution (RMD) obligations starting at age 73, while also supporting a cause you care about. The donated amount is excluded from your taxable income, which can provide a tax advantage, especially if you do not itemize deductions.

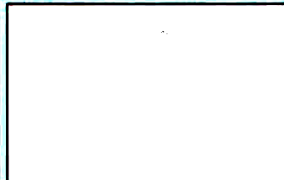
