They are making room for Christ to have a home.

### **Christmas is this coming Thursday!**

I wish all of you very blessed and joy-filled celebrations of Christ's birth! What a joy it is to welcome him. Please see this bulletin or website for the Christmas schedule. *A reminder to all our ministers, we need your help at all the Christmas Masses. Please sign up to serve – we have many spots to fill.* Here are a few suggestions for Christmas Mass this year...

1. Please come to a Mass other than early Christmas Eve. Traditionally, these Masses have been the most crowded—so please, please consider coming to a different Mass this year. The real date of the feast is Christmas Day. Jesus didn't come at a convenient day, time, or hour for Mary. Likely, he came during the night. Have some fun and change up the routine and come to the late-night Mass or on Christmas Day. Everyone will have a better and more comfortable experience of the Mass if we change up our routines and spread out among the Masses.

At St. Jude, the wonderful tradition of lesson and carols returns this year at 9:15 PM. Led by our 9 AM Sunday Choir, this is a wonderful prelude to the 10 PM Mass. It is an inspiring way to get into the spirit of our Christmas celebrations. At Midnight Mass, we remember that Christ came quietly when night was 'halfspent.' At the conclusion of this Mass, there is the very special blessing of the outdoor Manger. This is always a beautiful moment in the stillness of the night. On Christmas Day, in addition to the Mass of the Shepherds at the 9 AM, at 11 AM Mass we will have a wonderful choir to joyfully celebrate the Savior's birth.


## **Beware of Scams this Season**








## Ways to Give Beyond Cash

## QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION (QCD)

A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity. A QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, which is unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. QCDs don't require that you itemize, which due to recent tax law changes, means you may decide to take advantage of the higher standard deduction but still use a QCD for charitable giving.

#### <u>IRA</u>

By utilizing an IRA for charitable giving, you can satisfy your required minimum distribution (RMD) obligations starting at age 73, while also supporting a cause you care about. The donated amount is excluded from your taxable income, which can provide a tax advantage, especially if you do not itemize deductions.

#### **DONOR-ADVISED FUNDS (DAF)**

A DAF is like a charitable investment account for the sole purpose of supporting charitable organizations. When you contribute cash, securities or other assets to a donor advised fund, you are generally eligible to take an immediate tax deduction. Funds are disbursed at your discretion.
