We have great reasons to celebrate in these days of Christmas!

At Duvall, this Sunday we observe the patronal Feast of the Holy Innocents

This Sunday is December 28, the patronal Feast of the at Holy Innocents in Duvall. It will take the place of the Feast of the Holy Family at Duvall. The feast recalls the children who died at the hands of King Herod, because of his fear and jealousy of Christ, the infant King of the Jews, king of kings, and prince of peace. The Holy Innocents are also called the proto-martyrs, because they died for Christ before He suffered, died, and rose for us. We rejoice that today, by God's grace, they share in His victory over death and the new life Christ won for us. Let us ask these Holy Martyrs to continue to intercede for us and let us thank God for their watchful care over Holy Innocents Church.

The Feast of Holy Family is Sunday for St. Jude and St. Anthony

For the universal Church and the rest of our family, Sunday is the Feast of the Holy Family and Thursday is the Octave Day of Christmas (the eighth day of Christmas), and on it we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. This celebration reminds us that Jesus, Mary and Joseph give us an example of what is to be a 'holy family.' Pope Francis reflected on the mystery of the Holy Family some years ago:

The message that comes from the Holy Family is first of all a message of faith. In the family life of Mary and Joseph, God is truly at the center, and He is so in the Person of Jesus. This is why the Family of Nazareth is holy. Why? Because it is centered on Jesus.

When parents and children together breathe in this climate of faith, they have an energy that allows them to face even difficult trials, as the experience of the Holy Family shows, for example, in the dramatic event of their flight to Egypt: a difficult ordeal.

The Baby Jesus with his Mother Mary and with St. Joseph are a simple but so luminous icon of the family. The light it casts is the light of mercy and salvation for all the world, the light of truth for every man, for the human family and for individual families. This light which comes from the Holy Family encourages us to offer human warmth in those family situations in which, for various reasons, peace is lacking, harmony is lacking, and forgiveness is lacking. May our concrete solidarity not diminish especially with regard to the families who are

experiencing more difficult situations due to illness, unemployment, discrimination, the need to emigrate.... Let us pause here for a moment and pray in silence for all these families in difficulty, whether due to problems of illness, unemployment, discrimination, need to emigrate, due to difficulty in understanding each other and also to disunion. Let us pray in silence for all these families.

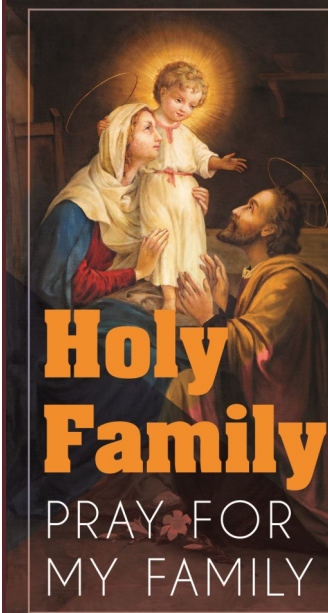

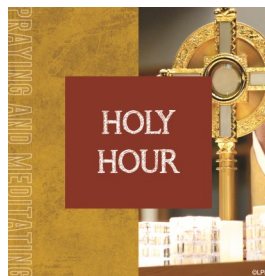

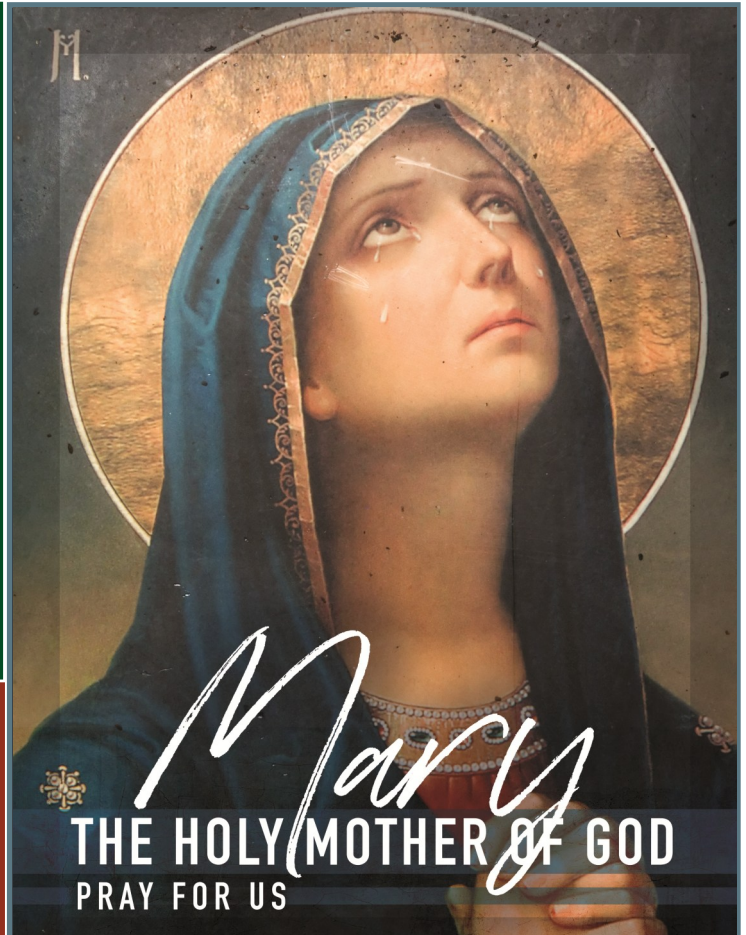

St Vincent de Paul Ministry

As the year ends, we reflect on the many gifts we have been given. We want to thank our parish and parishioners for their generosity over the last year. We have been truly blessed by your monetary, Christmas Giving Tree, and furniture or household goods donations. These gifts help us provide hope for the neighbors we serve.

Thank you for your prayers, which make a positive impact on our ministry. We experience miracles as a result. It doesn't seem possible that we can fulfill some requests, but we can feel Him guiding us when we hit a roadblock.

All year long we have been sharing stories of our experiences with people we served and what it's like to be a Vincentian. Here's a quick recap of our progress: through November, we received over 850 requests for assistance. We spent \$48,000 primarily on rent and utilities. Additionally, we distributed \$13,000 of donated items, including food/gas from donated gift cards, donated furniture and household goods, and clothing from KidVantage. Those we help include single parent families, minorities, immigrants, victims of domestic violence, disabled individuals, homeless people, and the unemployed or underemployed.

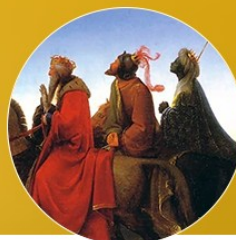

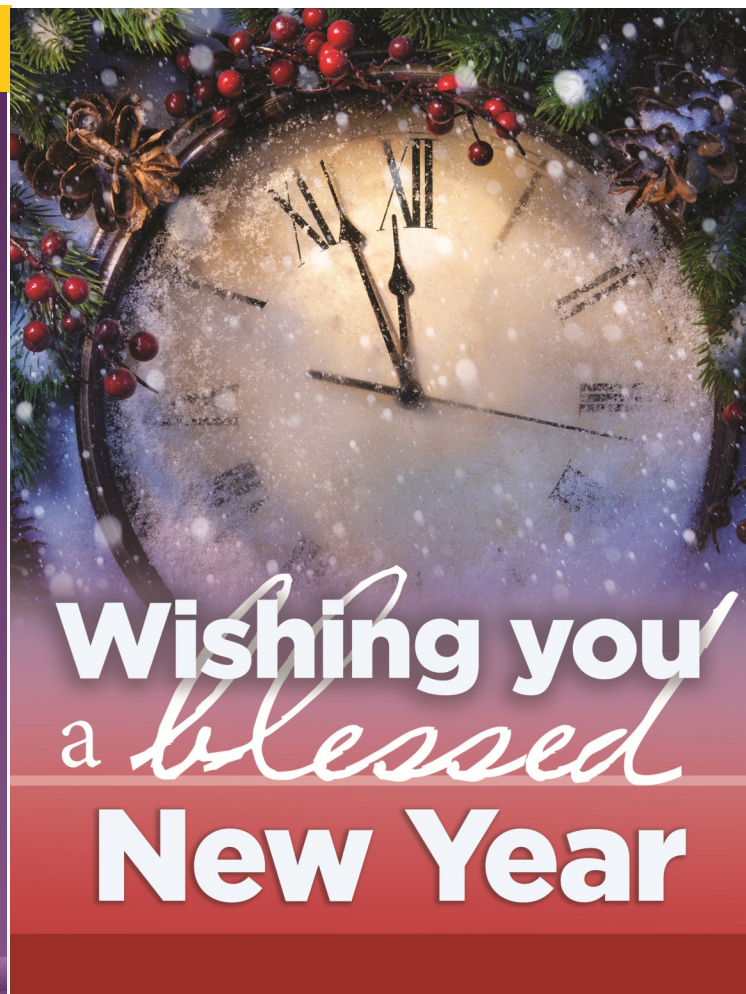

Ways to Give Beyond Cash

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE

DISTRIBUTION (QCD)

A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity. A QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, which is unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. QCDs don't require that you itemize, which due to recent tax law changes, means you may decide to take advantage of the higher standard deduction but still use a QCD for charitable giving.

IRA

By utilizing an IRA for charitable giving, you can satisfy your required minimum distribution (RMD) obligations starting at age 73, while also supporting a cause you care about. The donated amount is excluded from your taxable income, which can provide a tax advantage, especially if you do not itemize deductions.

DONOR-ADVISED FUNDS (DAF)

A DAF is like a charitable investment account for the sole purpose of supporting charitable organizations. When you contribute cash, securities or other assets to a donor advised fund, you are generally eligible to take an immediate tax deduction. Funds are disbursed at your discretion.
