A Volunteer's Experience

When I decided to volunteer, I was pretty sure that I'd feel good about contributing and making a difference in the community. I didn't realize the fruits that it would provide me personally.

I wasn't that familiar with the organization, its historical roots, and the mission that exists today just as strongly as it did when it was founded in 1833.

Luckily, I received training and had great mentors in the Vincentians at St. Jude. They encouraged me to partner with them on home visits and learn about the network of charities that can help neighbors in need. Eventually, I started taking the lead on some requests. In talking to neighbors, I see people facing every day and sometimes extraordinary challenges. I see their fears and their hopes. They're praying, we're praying. We try to find ways we can help; and it works out quite a bit thanks to the generosity of parishioners.

Personally, the best times are when we deliver a bed with clean sheets and pillows and we know that very morning they woke up on the floor; we made a difference.

Feeling a closer connection to God is the main benefit in volunteering. And right up there is developing friendships with the other Vincentians in the parish. These people care! Want to learn about it? Pray on it and reach out if there's even a chance you're being called!

July 17, 2025 Progress Report: \$190,678 in Pledges Received 83% of our Combined Goal 18% Registered Families Pledged

Ways to Give QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity. A QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, which is unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. QCDs don't require that you itemize, which due to recent tax law changes, means you may decide to take advantage of the higher standard deduction but still use a QCD for charitable giving.

IRA DISTRIBUTIONS (RMD)

By utilizing an IRA for charitable giving, you can satisfy your required minimum distribution (RMD) obligations starting at age 73, while also supporting a cause you care about. The donated amount is excluded from your taxable income, which can provide a tax advantage, especially if you do not itemize deductions.

DONOR ADVISED FUNDS

A charitable investment account for the sole purpose of supporting charitable organizations.
