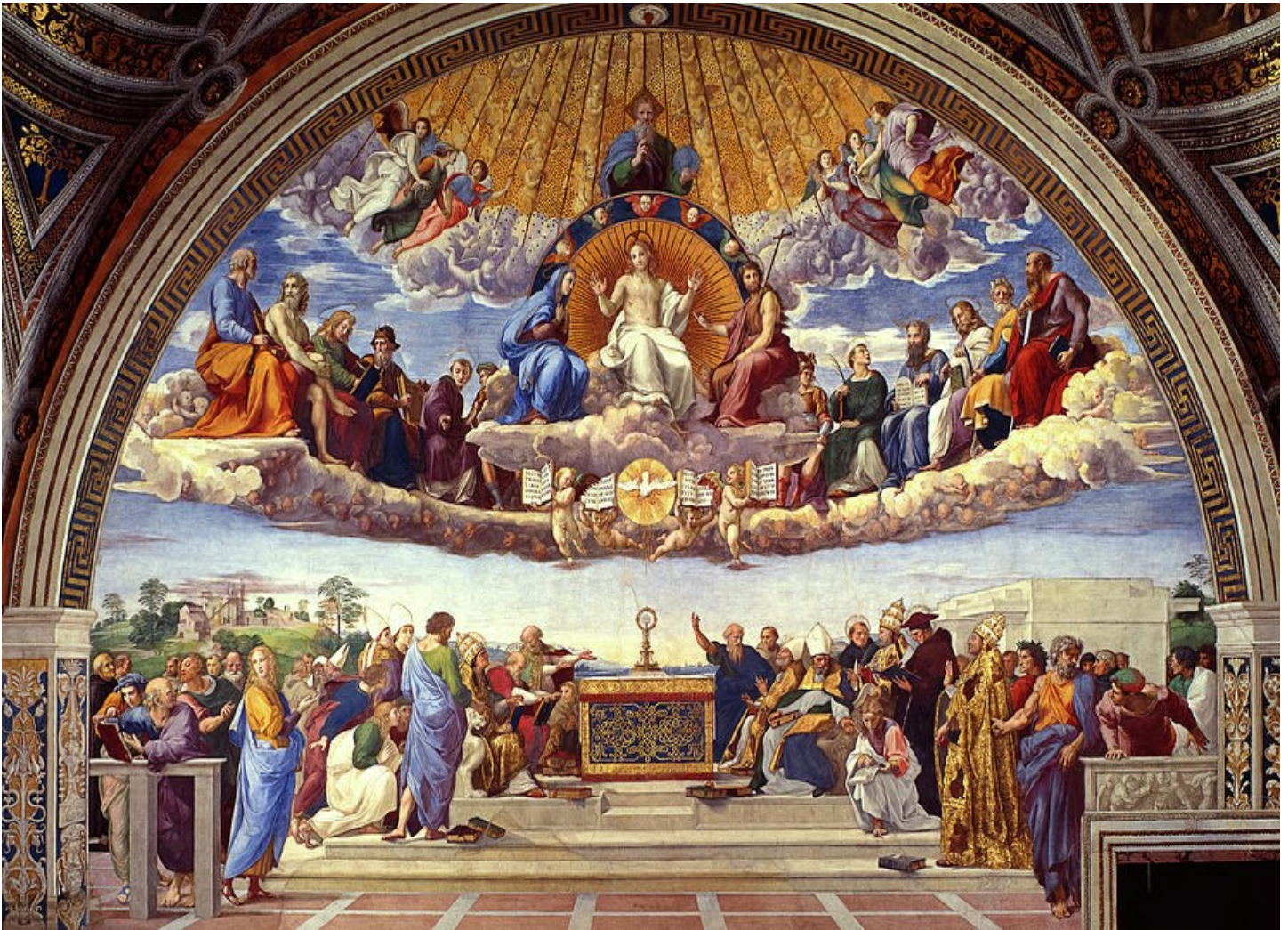

CORPUS CHRISTI

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, Corpus Christi. Each year the Church dedicates the second Sunday after Pentecost to pondering this sacrament. The Blessed Sacrament has been given to us by the Lord to nourish and sustain us on our pilgrim way to the banquet of Heaven. Vatican II called us to a deeper appreciation of the Eucharist as the source and summit of the Christian life. At the Altar, Christ becomes really and truly present to us, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity! Nothing less! This sacrament is given to us for our transformation, so that we may become more like Jesus! Here is a passage from a Corpus Christi homily of Pope Benedict to help us reflect on the gift of the Holy Eucharist this week:

Everything begins, one might say, from the heart of Christ who, at the Last Supper, on the eve of his passion, thanked and praised God and by so doing, with the power of his love, transformed the meaning of death which he was on his way to encounter. The fact that the Sacrament of the Altar acquired the name "Eucharist" — "thanksgiving" — expresses precisely this: that changing the substance of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is the fruit of the gift that Christ made of himself, the gift of a Love stronger than death, divine Love which raised him from the dead. This is why the Eucharist is the food of eternal life, the Bread of Life. From Christ's heart, from his "Eucharistic prayer" on the eve of his passion flows that dynamism which transforms reality in its cosmic, human and historical dimensions. All things proceed from God, from the omnipotence of his Triune Love, incarnate in Jesus. Christ's heart is steeped in this Love; therefore he can thank and praise God even in the face of betrayal and violence, and in this way changes things, people and the world.

This transformation is possible thanks to a communion stronger than division, the communion of God himself. The word "communion", which we also use to designate the Eucharist, in itself sums up the vertical and horizontal dimensions of Christ's gift. The words "to receive communion", referring to the act of eating the Bread of the Eucharist, are beautiful and very eloquent. In fact, when we do this act we enter into communion with the very life of Jesus, into the dynamism of this life which is given to us and for us. From God, through Jesus, to us: a unique communion is transmitted through the Blessed Eucharist.

We have heard the words of the Apostle Paul to the Christians of Corinth: "The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are

many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread" (1 Cor 10:16-17). St Augustine helps us to understand the dynamic of Eucharistic communion when he mentions a sort of vision that he had, in which Jesus said to him: "I am the food of strong men; grow and you shall feed on me; nor shall you change me, like the food of your flesh into yourself, but you shall be changed into my likeness" (Confessions, vii, 10, 18).

POPE BENEDICT

JUNE - THE MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART

Next Friday, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It is observed every June and thus Church celebrates the month June as the month of the Sacred Heart. We remember and give thanks for the passionate love of Jesus which flows from his wounded heart. God's love expressed in and through the heart of his beloved Son is what saves us and restores us to right relations to God and our neighbor. The love we have received from Him is meant to flow outward from us so that all might know and be caught up into the love of God. May our invocation of the Sacred Heart this month remind us of the call we have received to pass on this love in our broken world.

MASS DURING THE SUMMER

Summer is a time when many of us try to get out enjoy the nice weather and travel a bit. It is a wonderful thing to rest in God's creation for a while. As we experience the beauty of the mountains and sound over the summer, let us be mindful of the source of these wonderful blessings. There is no better time or reason to celebrate Sunday Mass than over the summer! The essence of Sunday Eucharist is offering thanks and praise for the many gifts he has given us. Whether you're here or away, praying the Mass each Sunday helps us appreciate vacation time all the more. I hope you will take advantage of the universality of our Church, and take time to pray the Mass with other Catholics as you travel this summer... and also to make it a priority to give God thanks and praise every Sunday here at St. Jude, Holy Innocents, and St Anthony. Our vacation time especially reminds us all of the many reasons we have to give thanks to God.

PRIEST DAYS

Next week, the priests of the Archdiocese will gather for our annual meetings. It will be good to be able to gather, pray, and reflect. I will be away until Friday. Please pray that our gathering will be fruitful: we ask God to help us to grow together, and plan well for future ministry in the Archdiocese. Know that you will be in our prayers while we are away.

At the beginning of each day in the morning, offer your whole day to the Sacred Heart of Jesus in prayer.

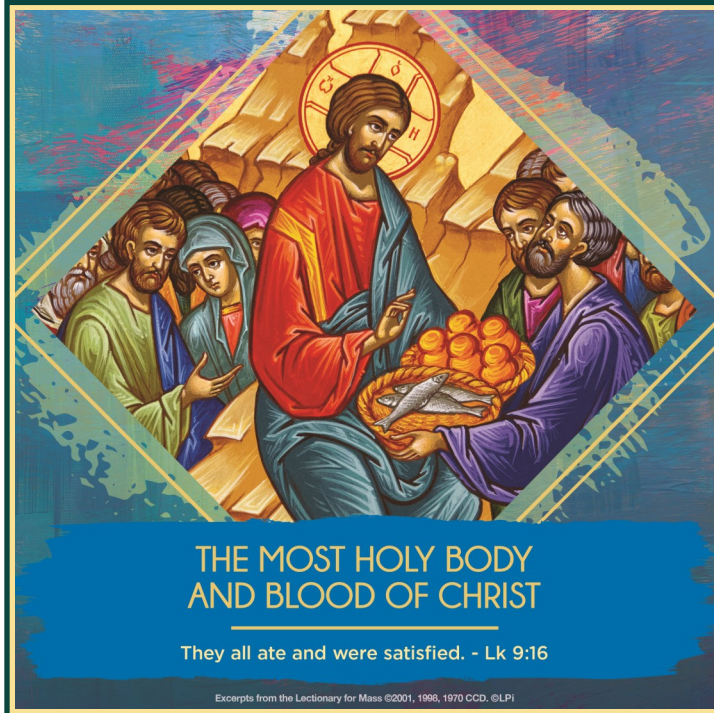
First Friday Devotion

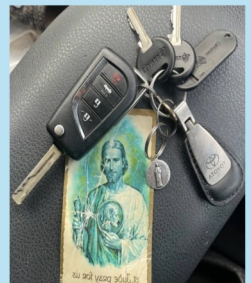
How to Participate

4. Deliver the meal to the shed on the lower parking lot of the church (do not deliver to the parish hall kitchen or the office). The combination lock code is 4982.
5. Some guests have dietary restrictions so please include a sign that lists the main ingredients and if the dish contains dairy, nuts or other ingredients that may trigger allergies
6. Plates, bowls, utensils, etc are not necessary
7. Retrieve your dish the next day

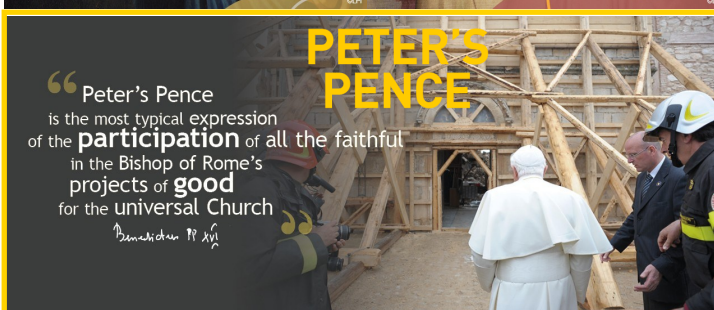

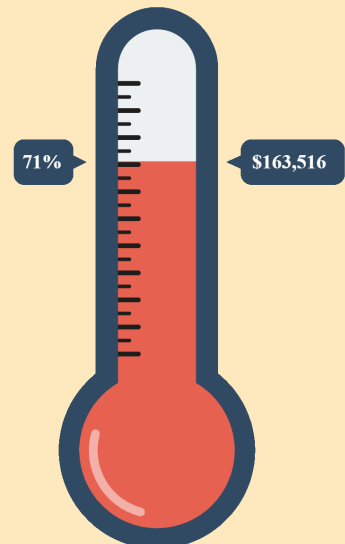

AROUND THE ARCHDIOCESE

Lay Ministers needed for Eastside Deanery Pastoral Care Team

To support the on-call Priests in the Eastside Deanery, we have a small group of Lay Ministers who take the initial calls from hospital nurses and Chaplains, adult care facilities, a patient's family member, or the patient themselves. The Lay Minister takes all of the necessary information for the on-call Priest, and then calls the Priest who is scheduled for that part of the Deanery. Each Lay Minister covers the same hours each week. The "shifts" are 9 AM to 4 PM, and 4 PM to 9 AM the following day, seven days a week.

The Ministry is currently short one Lay Minister. We need someone to cover the Wednesday night and Thursday night shifts. Ways to Give

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity. A QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, which is unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. QCDs don't require that you itemize, which due to recent tax law changes, means you may decide to take advantage of the higher standard deduction but still use a QCD for charitable giving.

IRA DISTRIBUTIONS (RMD)

By utilizing an IRA for charitable giving, you can satisfy your required minimum distribution (RMD) obligations starting at age 73, while also supporting a cause you care about. The donated amount is excluded from your taxable income, which can provide a tax advantage, especially if you do not itemize deductions.

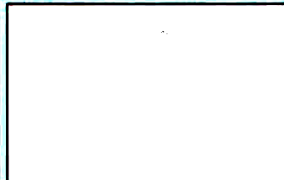
