Dear friends in Christ,

This past week we celebrated the feast day of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation Nun who lived in 17th Century France and who was a visionary. In a time when faith was cold and focused much on the judgement of God, Jesus revealed to her his heart burning with love, calling people to holiness. She wrote powerfully of the message she was given to promote devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Here is a passage from one of her letters for our reflection:

It seems to me that our Lord's earnest desire to have his Sacred Heart honored in a special way is directed toward renewing the effects of redemption in our souls. For the sacred heart is an inexhaustible fountain and its sole desire is to pour itself out into the hearts of the humble so as to free them and prepare them to lead lives according to his good pleasure.

From this divine heart three streams flow endlessly. The first is the stream of mercy for sinners; it pours into their hearts sentiments of contrition and repentance. The second is the stream of charity which helps all in need and especially aids those seeking perfection to find the means of surmounting their difficulties. From the third stream flow love and light for the benefit of his friends who have attained perfection; these he wishes to unite to himself so that they may share his knowledge and commandments and, in their individual ways, devote themselves wholly to advancing his glory.

This divine heart is an abyss of all blessings, and into it the poor should submerge all their needs. It is an abyss of joy in which all of us can immerse our sorrows. It is an abyss of lowliness to counteract our foolishness, an abyss of mercy for the wretched, an abyss of love to meet our every need.

Therefore, you must unite yourselves to the heart of our Lord Jesus Christ, both at the beginning of your conversion in order to obtain proper dispositions, and at its end in order to make reparation. Are you making no progress in prayer? Then you need only offer God the prayers which the Savior has poured out for us



in the sacrament of the altar. Offer God his fervent love in reparation for your sluggishness. In the course of every activity pray as follows: "My God, I do this or I endure that in the heart of your Son and according to his holy counsels. I offer it to you in reparation for anything blameworthy or imperfect in my actions." Continue to do this in every circumstance of life. And every time that some punishment, affliction or injustice comes your way, say to yourself: "Accept this as sent to you by the Sacred Heart of Jesus Christ in order to unite yourself to him."

But above all preserve peace of heart. This is more valuable than any treasure. In order to preserve it there is nothing more useful than renouncing your own will and substituting for it the will of the divine heart. In this way his will can carry out for us whatever contributes to his glory, and we will be happy to be his subjects and to trust entirely in him. ST. MARGARET MARY

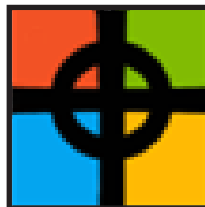

Maximize Your Giving with a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)

If you're 70½ or older and required to take a distribution from your IRA (RMD), consider a QCD known as a Qualified Charitable Distribution. A QCD allows you to transfer up to \$100,000 directly from your IRA to St. Jude Catholic Church. This counts toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) but is excluded from your taxable income—saving you money while supporting our parish.

For those who take their RMD at the end of the year or early in the year, now is the perfect time to plan your strategy. Speak with your IRA custodian to arrange a direct transfer to the church—it's a simple process that benefits both you and St. Jude.

VINCENTIAN MINISTRY

If you're struggling with your faith and/or going through the rituals in a mindless way, you might try getting involved in service to your neighbor. St Vincent de Paul work has a way of getting us out of our privileged bubble and indifference.

Many years ago, growing up in a Catholic parish, I thought SVdP was a male-dominated organization mostly dedicated to operating thrift stores. It wasn't until I went to my first meeting at St. Jude Parish that I realized the work was way more interesting. First, it was not just for men, women too could be Vincentians. Secondly, it put me in touch with my local community and gave me first-hand knowledge of the high living costs in Redmond, and the challenges people face making ends meet. And finally, it taught me about a variety of organizations and churches who are trying to help.

St. Vincent de Paul is not a social club with lots of parties and events. Rather, we bond in our work, sharing prayer and insights that help us grow spiritually. We help families and individuals with what would be small obstacles to many of us, but large problems for someone who has a limited income and then loses that income temporarily due to an accident, illness or job loss. When you can visit our neighbors in their homes and provide some assistance, it is very satisfying and humbling.

Here's how it works. A Redmond neighbor will call the Seattle SVdP helpline phone number and put in their request. The request will be routed to our St. Jude SVdP Conference. Our dispatch volunteer will assign a case to one of our Vincentians. He/she will find a partner and arrange a home visit. In the visit we try to ascertain how we can best help. Usually, it is rent or a utility payment, but often we discover other ways to help such as furniture, kitchen items, or children's clothing. Vincentians are typically given one or two requests for help each month. The time commitment is flexible around our schedule and the people we serve.

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity. A QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, which is unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. QCDs don't require that you itemize, which due to recent tax law changes, means you may decide to take advantage of the higher standard deduction but still use a QCD for charitable giving.

IRA DISTRIBUTIONS (RMD)

By utilizing an IRA for charitable giving, you can satisfy your required minimum distribution (RMD) obligations starting at age 73, while also supporting a cause you care about. The donated amount is excluded from your taxable income, which can provide a tax advantage, especially if you do not itemize deductions.

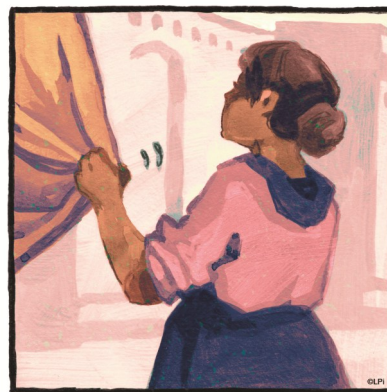
