THE FEAST OF THE GUARDIAN ANGELS

As I write this, it is the Feast of the Guardian Angels. The Guardian Angels are the secondary patrons of Archdiocese, so it is even more appropriate to celebrate their watchful care and ask their help. According to the Gospel, every one of us has an angel which beholds the face of God. They help us, guide us and intercede for us. Let us readily ask for their aid.

Saint Padre Pio relied on his Guardian Angel throughout his life and composed this prayer which I commend to you:

**O Holy Guardian Angel,
take care of my soul and my body.
Enlighten my mind so that I may know the Lord
better
and love Him with all my heart.
Assist me in my prayers so I do not give in to
distractions, but pay the greatest attention.
Help me with your advice so that I may see the
good
and carry it out generously.
Defend me from the snares of the infernal enemy
and support me in temptations,
so that I may always emerge victorious.
Make up for my coldness in the worship of the
Lord: do not cease to watch over me
until you have brought me to Heaven,
where we shall praise the Good God together for
all eternity. Amen.**

OCTOBER - LET'S PRAY THE ROSARY FOR PEACE

We have begun the month of October, a month when we remember Our Lady of the Rosary, a month when we recall the miracle of the dancing sun, foretold by Our Lady of Fatima. It is a month which reminds us of the power of this prayer. Pope Leo has invited us to pray the rosary daily during this month for peace. So many people are suffering from the effects of war and violence in Ukraine, and the Middle East. So many Christians are persecuted and murdered for their faith, their witness goes unnoticed. I want to encourage us to join with the Pope in praying the Rosary for peace and an end to the many violent conflicts among peoples and nations. Let us gather after dinner, whether around your dining room table, kneeling in the living room or walking around the block, and pray the Rosary invoking Our Lady's aid and intercession. Additionally, let us reflect on the mysteries of her Son's life, death, and resurrection and grow in our faith and trust in him.

RESPECT LIFE MONTH

October is also Respect Life month: a time to renew ourselves in the truth that every human life is sacred and is a gift from God. It is all the more important that we work to build a culture that respects the gift of life. It is a time to work for a society where no woman feels a need for, or pressure to, have an abortion, and is instead helped to carry her child to term. It is a time to work for a society where every elderly person feels respect and love, is cared for, such that physician-assisted suicide is never seen as an option. A few years ago, Archbishop Etienne wrote a beautiful letter which expresses, better than I could, the important of building a culture of life:

As Catholics, we praise God for his creative genius. We proclaim that all life is good, and that every human life is very good. Every human life from the moment of conception is a sign of God's free choice to bring forth new life. The choice is God's. God chooses. God chooses love. God chooses life.... We live in a time when great liberty is taken with human language. People freely redefine the meaning of words to confuse reality. Thus abortion — taking life — is accepted in the name of "health care." Life is nurtured in health care. Abortion is not health care. Rather, it is the unjust taking of innocent life. Abortion is the rejection of a loving choice of God, who is Life.

Pope Francis reminds us of the tenderness and love of God, who is the source of all that exists: "God's love is the fundamental moving force in all created things. ... Even the fleeting life of the least of beings is the object of his love, and in its few seconds of existence, God enfolds it with his affection." Our goal is to build a culture of life. We do this by recognizing the dignity of every human being, whether members of our own family, our neighbors, the unborn, the poor, immigrants, the elderly and dying, even prisoners and those on death row. Every human life is sacred and deserving of respect.

We believe in God. We believe in Jesus Christ his only begotten Son. We believe in the power of his death and resurrection. We believe that our life comes from the very life of God. We believe that our lives have been redeemed by the lifeblood of Jesus Christ, and the mercy and love of God. We will continue our efforts to build up this culture and our society upon the strong foundation of the God of Life.

A LETTER FROM TERRI & GERRY WEILER

From Terri & Gerry Weiler

Brief recap: A year ago, our 13-year-old grandson, Shay, suffered a massive brain aneurysm. The initial diagnosis was grim, and we did what so many of you would do finding you and your family in a similar situation: we prayed. And we asked our extended family and friends to pray as well. At the time, we were traveling out of country but fortunately today email makes our world so much smaller. Gerry reached out immediately to Father Johnson, asking him to say a Mass for Shay, and to his brother Knights that Shay be added to their prayer chain. When the need arose for additional funds to help the family, many of you purchased "Shay's Brigade" T-shirts or made a donation to the t-shirt fund and/or to the Knights "Raise the Paddle" at last year's Oktoberfest. It was all so generous and appreciated.

Because many of you have asked, we thought we would share an update of where Shay is now and how far he's come in this last year. After a harrowing medevac transfer stateside (from South Korea to Washington, DC), and an extensive hospital stay, Shay rejoined his family at home in February. He continues to attend numerous therapy sessions three times each week, each time a full day of helping him to continue to relearn basically everything! He can stand and walk with assistance, which he does almost exclusively at home. On that rare occasion when the family goes out, he is able to operate his electric wheelchair by himself. Current therapy focuses on regaining strength and mobility on his right side, working with his aphasia (he has difficulty making a one-to-one connection between a word and the object itself), and working to resolve the underlying issue (the aneurysm itself). To that end, Shay recently completed FIVE sessions where doctors using a laser knife basically cauterized the aneurysm. This will allow scar tissue to form that will ultimately be broken down and reabsorbed by the body. The good news is that Shay experienced no regression of his newly achieved progress. The bad news is that it will take about 3 years for the scar tissue to form and during that time there is always the chance of a re-rupture. Prayers continue to be warranted.

Next up, Shay will have two procedures: the first one will use a redundant nerve in his face to replace one that was damaged during initial treatment. This will give him back his beautiful gentle smile! The second surgery will be to correct an issue with his eye, allowing him to fully open/close that eye.

Words will never express how grateful Gerry and I continue to be for the prayers and best wishes we have received from everyone at St. Jude's! We are so overwhelmed and truly humbled by your response, though not at all surprised as we have always known this to be a most generous and loving church.

Blessings on you all! We continue to hold you and yours in our thoughts and prayers!

As the weather cools, our Hot Meal program is transitioning to Hot Soup on Sundays—a comforting way to nourish those in need. A heartfelt thank you to everyone who has contributed so far.

Many of our neighbors experiencing homelessness, especially those living in their vehicles, often go without a warm meal. This winter, you can make a meaningful difference by preparing and delivering a hearty, nutritious pot of soup for our Safe Parking guests. Your kindness brings more than just warmth—it offers hope, compassion, and love.

WHAT: Vegetarian or Non-Vegetarian nutritious soup, salad and bread

TIMING: Every Sunday; Deliver by 5:00PM

HOW MUCH: Prepare food for 8-10 safe parking guests

WHERE DO I DELIVER: St. Jude Church, Redmond, WA. to the shed

in the lower parking lot. The code for the lock is 4982. Deliver the food in a crock pot or Instapot



HOW IT WORKS:

1. Review the meal calendar on the online sign-up site and pick a week that is open
2. On the sign up sheet identify what type of soup you'll be preparing
3. Prepare and deliver the food by 5:00PM on Sunday to the shed located at the back of the lower parking lot (do not deliver the food to the parish hall kitchen or the office)
4. Include a sign that identifies the type of soup. Note if the food contains dairy, nuts or other ingredients that may trigger allergies
5. Retrieve your dishes the next day

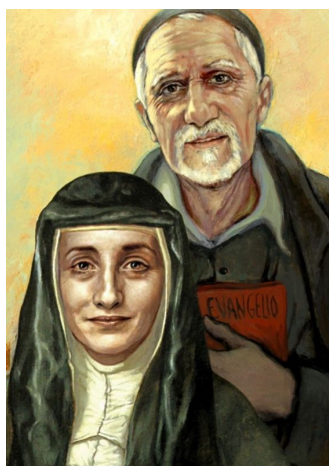

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity. A QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, which is unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. QCDs don't require that you itemize, which due to recent tax law changes, means you may decide to take advantage of the higher standard deduction but still use a QCD for charitable giving.

IRA DISTRIBUTIONS (RMD)

By utilizing an IRA for charitable giving, you can satisfy your required minimum distribution (RMD) obligations starting at age 73, while also supporting a cause you care about. The donated amount is excluded from your taxable income, which can provide a tax advantage, especially if you do not itemize deductions.
