I feel very blessed indeed to be able to serve you as a priest and to be able to bring the joy and hope of the Lord to you in this ministry.

I pray that I may be able to serve you and the Lord well for many years to come. Thank you for your love of the Lord and your "partnership in the gospel." Let us continue to work together to bring the Lord Jesus, and his love, light, peace and hope to Redmond, Carnation, Duvall and beyond. Please by assured of my prayers for you. I hold you all in my heart.

TRINITY SUNDAY

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, a mystery of the very nature of God which marks our lives as Christians. Every prayer we make begins with the sign of the cross, invoking the name of the Blessed Trinity. This is how God has chosen to reveal himself to us as, one God, yet at the same time three persons. A few years ago, Pope Benedict gave this meditation on the mystery and this calling we share in and through the Blessed Trinity:

Today we contemplate the Most Holy Trinity as Jesus introduced us to it. He revealed to us that God is love "not in the oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance" (Preface). He is the Creator and merciful Father; he is the Only-Begotten Son, eternal Wisdom incarnate, who died and rose for us: he is the Holy Spirit who moves all things, cosmos and history, toward their final, full recapitulation. Three Persons who are one God because the Father is love, the Son is love, the Spirit is love. God is wholly and only love, the purest, infinite and eternal love. He does not live in splendid solitude but rather is an inexhaustible source of life that is ceaselessly given and communicated. To a certain extent we can perceive this by observing both the macro-universe: our earth, the planets, the stars, the galaxies; and the *micro-universe: cells, atoms, elementary* particles. The "name" of the Blessed Trinity is, in a certain sense, imprinted upon all things because all that exists, down to the last particle, is in relation; in this way we catch a glimpse of God as relationship and ultimately, Creator Love. All things derive from love, aspire to love and move impelled by love, though naturally with varying degrees of awareness and freedom. "O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!" (Ps 8: 1) the Psalmist exclaims. In speaking of the "name", the Bible refers to God himself, his truest identity. It is an identity that shines upon the whole of Creation, in which all beings for the very fact that they exist and because of the "fabric" of which they are made point to a transcendent Principle, to eternal and infinite Life which is given, in a word, to Love. "In him we live and move and have our being", St Paul said at the Areopagus of Athens (Acts 17: 28). The strongest proof that we are made in the image of the Trinity is this: love alone makes us happy because we live in a relationship, and we live to love and to be loved. Borrowing an analogy from biology, we could say that imprinted upon his "genome", the human being bears a profound mark of the Trinity, of God as Love. POPE BENEDICT

May God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit surround you with his love! Blessings on your week! Fr Johnson

June 5, 2025 Progress Report: \$144,451 in Pledges Received 63% of our Combined Goal 14% Registered Families Pledged

This year, our Archdiocese goal is **\$128,000**. The money raised <u>above this goal</u> will come back to St Jude for our parish project, which is to replace the flooring in the parish hall. The new flooring will not need waxing and will be easier and cheaper to maintain. ST VINCENT DE PAUL UPDATE

St. Jude Parishioners,

Let us tell you about a hardworking mother who was recently helped by St. Jude Vincentians. This mother left everything behind in another state when she fled an unsafe situation with her kids. She contacted the local SVdP Conference asking for rental assistance while she found a job. When St. Jude Vincentians went to visit her, they had to sit on the floor. The family had no furniture in the apartment.

This is the kind of situation where a small amount of assistance can prevent a family from spiraling into homelessness. With just a few hundred dollars of rent assistance, we helped this grateful neighbor get back on her feet. St. Jude Vincentians also gave her furniture and household goods as she organized the new apartment for her family.

In another case St. Jude Vincentians visited a disabled man who had his water shut off the day before. We immediately called the SVdP Treasurer, who personally drove a check to Union Hill Water District office, and the water was turned back on that same day.

These are examples of how SVdP, St. Jude Conference, helps needy neighbors in the Redmond area. We help families and individuals with what would be small obstacles to most of us, but large problems to someone who has limited income and then loses that income temporarily due to an accident, illness or job loss.

Would you help us? Have you considered joining St. Vincent de Paul Ministry? Jesus asked us to "bring good news to the poor." (Luke 4:18). We could use your help sharing the "good news" and blessings that we have with our less fortunate neighbors here in Redmond.

Ways to Give QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity. A QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, which is unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. QCDs don't require that you itemize, which due to recent tax law changes, means you may decide to take advantage of the higher standard deduction but still use a QCD for charitable giving.

IRA DISTRIBUTIONS (RMD)

By utilizing an IRA for charitable giving, you can satisfy your required minimum distribution (RMD) obligations starting at age 73, while also supporting a cause you care about. The donated amount is excluded from your taxable income, which can provide a tax advantage, especially if you do not itemize deductions.
