At Christ the King Catholic Primary School we are committed to providing a fully inclusive and accessible environment for all pupils, staff, parents and visitors. This accessibility plan outlines how we will meet the needs of disabled pupils, staff and visitors within our school.

Overall Aims:

- To ensure that disabled pupils and pupils with additional needs have access to relevant equipment to support their access, development and learning.
- To continue to ensure that all pupils are able to access the curriculum and wider school life and that reasonable adjustments are made when required.
- To ensure that all staff are trained in meeting the needs of all pupils including those with additional needs and disabilities to enable them to access the curriculum.
