How to Stay Faithful

• Be Content with What You Have (Proverbs 17:1)

• Be Faithful in Your Responsibilities (Proverbs 17:2)

A wise servant who fulfills duties well gains trust and inheritance, outshining a shameful son. Diligence in small tasks prepares you for greater roles. Stay faithful in what God entrusts to you.

• Embrace God's Refining Work (Proverbs 17:3)

Just as a furnace purifies gold, God tests and refines hearts through trials. Submit to His discipline without resentment to grow stronger in faith, avoiding the fragility of a reprobate life.

Guard Against Deceptive Words (Proverbs 17:4)

Wicked people listen to lies and harmful speech. Anchor yourself in God's truth to discern and reject deceit, protecting your integrity from corruption.

Avoid Condescension and Evil Intent (Proverbs 17:5)

Mocking the poor or rejoicing in others' misfortunes dishonors God. Practice humility and compassion, recognizing everyone's value as God's creation.

• Think Long-Term (Proverbs 17:6)

Grandchildren are a crown to the aged, and parents are the glory of their children. Live with integrity to leave a godly legacy that blesses future generations.

• Speak Truthfully (Proverbs 17:7)

Lies, especially from leaders, reveal folly. Let your words reflect honesty and build trust, aligning with God's call to truthful speech.

• Forgive and Preserve Relationships (Proverbs 17:9)

Covering a transgression promotes love, while gossip destroys friendships. Choose forgiveness and wisdom to maintain harmony, verifying facts before acting.

• Welcome Correction (Proverbs 17:10)

A wise person heeds rebuke, but fools ignore it. Embrace correction to grow in wisdom, avoiding the losses fools face:

- **Wisdom**: Fools reject instruction, even in hardship.
- Peace: Evil men seek conflict, not humility.
- **Safety**: Fools harm those around them.
- Heritage: Evil actions bring lasting consequences, as seen in biblical examples like Absalom.
