SERVING OPPORTUNITIES & ACTS OF KINDNESS



- 1. Write an unsolicited LinkedIn testimonial for someone who is out of work.
- 2. Find an accountability partner and commit to walking dogs at a local animal shelter each month.
- 3. Identify one person you can personally invest in (your time and talents) over the next year.
- 4. Write a thank you card to a teacher for all they are doing this year. (Do this even if you don't have kids or kids in school!)
- 5. Start a Senior Service Team through your church or community for elderly people who need a wellness check phone call, help with grocery shopping or a hand with tasks around the house.
- 6. Once a month, double the normal tip you would give to a restaurant server or anyone in the service industry.
- 7. Compliment at least one person every single day.
- 8. Pay for a meal for a police officer, healthcare worker or any essential worker.

- 9. Write a note to thank someone who has served or is currently serving in the military.
- 10. Pick up the phone and call a friend or client on their birthday.
- 11. Send loved ones a Christmas quiz so that you can select thoughtful gifts.
- 12. Cut your long hair and donate it to Locks of Love.
- 13. Write one thank you note a month to a client or family member, just because.
- 14. Take lunch or dinner—or give a restaurant gift card—to people who have to work on a holiday (fire fighters, nursing home staff, etc.).
- 15. Drop off a care package to a new mom or dad offer to babysit so they can have some down time (or a much needed nap).
- 16. Tutor a student who needs a little extra help.
- 17. Help build a house for someone with Habitat for Humanity, your local church, etc.
- 18. Volunteer with Girls on the Run to help a child in need.
- 19. Adopt a family to buy gifts for during the holidays.
- 20. Bring a pre-cooked meal to someone you know who has lost a loved one or is going through a hard time.
