WHAT'S BEEN GOING ON

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity - CiA - Caring for the Planet

The Week of Prayer started with the inter-church quiz at Long Furlong on Friday 19 Feb 2024. There were seven teams from six churches. Abingdon Baptist Church won and will be hosting the quiz next year. For more information, please see the Abingdon blog at https://abingdonblog.co.uk/?p=31794. A total of £104.37 was raised and this will go to the charity SeeSaw, for bereaved children.



About 70 people came along to the United Service at Our Lady and St Edmund's RC Church. The service was led by Fr Jamie and we welcomed our speakers from the John Ray initiative (JRI), Martin and Margot Hodson.

In the talk by Martin, we heard how higher temperatures are impacting on our planet affecting our weather, our oceans, our animals and plants, the main cause being carbon dioxide emissions. If these emissions are not greatly reduced, there will be even more global warming – it has already risen above projected limits. And in all of this it is the poorer countries that are hit the hardest although they are the lowest emitters.

Margot talked about our responsibility to protect the planet. As Christians we believe that God created everything – Genesis 1-2 – hence it is important that we remember that everything is connected - we are part of this connection and therefore have a role in caring for the planet. We must not forget the material world as part of God's creation.

A collection raised £90 for the continued work of the JRI.

Following on from the united service, midday prayers took place every day of the following week at St Nics Church, continuing on the theme of 'Caring for the planet'. We had speakers who talked about ways we could reduce our impact on the planet, including EcoChurch, plastics, transport, biodiversity and working with young people, who will have to deal with the consequences in the future. These talks were be uploaded the CiA website for those who could not attend. Each session was followed by Q&A and prayer, and ended with refreshments and fellowship. Around 26 – 35 people attended each day. Thanks to all those at St Nics who organised the wonderful refreshments, and to the speakers.

Abingdon Food Bank

Abingdon Food Bank needs your support more than ever now, with the increasing cost of living adversely affecting those already struggling to make ends meet. A typical food parcel might contain: cereal, soup, pasta, rice, tinned tomatoes/pasta sauce, lentils, beans and pulses, tinned meat, tinned vegetables, tea/coffee, tinned fruit, biscuits, UHT milk, fruit juice. Also toiletries, nappies and household cleaning items. Food can be taken to either Preston Road Food Bank or Christ Church Food Bank. Some supermarkets also have collection baskets. Financial donations are also welcome.

This café was set up in response to the Homes for Ukraine scheme and to provide wider support of refugees through a collaborative partnership of Christ Church and Host Abingdon, the main partners, as well as many other churches in Abingdon as well as local groups and organisations, including the Food Bank.
