The April member spotlight is Gina Basaldua! Gina grew up in the Salinas Valley as the daughter of a local farmer. She attended California Polytechnic State University in San Luis Obispo, where she received a Bachelor's Degree in Crop Science along with two minors in Agribusiness and Plant Protection Science. Following graduation, Gina joined Taylor Farms in 2007 as a Harvest Coordinator managing the first phase of the automated romaine machine. That same year, with the automated harvest in her background, she added the baby leaf program to her job description where she was responsible for managing all spinach, spring mix, arugula and various other tender leaf crop acres, from seed to harvest. In her most recent role as Tender Leaf Grower Relations Manager, Gina has been instrumental in managing and developing new varieties and blends that have helped Taylor Farms in providing the finest quality vegetables that feed millions of people across North America. She feels the best part of her role is that she gets to work closely with growers on ground selection, forecasting and crop nutrient efficiency.

When Gina is not in the fields, she enjoys spending time with her husband and three daughters, Grace, Francesca and Cecilia. She donates her time to various local organizations such as relay for life, ag against hunger and 4-H/FFA clubs. She has served on a few other local scholarship committees. She also enjoys coaching volleyball, something she looks forward to doing with each of her daughters. It important to her to teach and show her daughters the importance of giving back to our communities. Both of her parents dedicated their lives to service; something she hopes to pass on to her children.

Her advice to the younger women entering the industry is, "keep pushing and give it your all. Working in the produce world has had its share of highs and lows for me.
