- **Develop recommendations** for how to partner with communities to address oral health disparities, public health trust in tap water, and provide accurate information about prevention programs like community water fluoridation.
- Compile a report by June 30, 2025 for the state legislature that outlines these findings and recommendations.

- Identified circumstances that make a person more vulnerable to health disparities.
 - Communities document (draft for report)
- Report outline/draft is in progress

- Create a plan for culturally informed community engagement trusted messenger, listening circles, focus groups (TODAY)
- **Develop recommendations** for how to partner with communities to address oral health disparities, public health trust in tap water, and provide accurate information about prevention programs like community water fluoridation.

Culturally Informed Community Engagement

 Translating materials and providing interpreters
- Community-led initiatives
 Partnering with local leaders and organizations
- Respectful dialogue and listening
 Actively listening to community members' perspectives and concerns
- Follow-up and continued relationship/dialogue

Culturally Informed Community Engagement

- "What will I get out of this?"
- Thoughtful, intentional, engaging invitation
- Acknowledgment of time and energy invested by community members
