# LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT RE Gerry Ellis (Denbigh United)

The Presbytery acknowledged that it was gathered on the traditional territory of the Kecoughtan tribe, part of the Algonquin language group that resided on the East Coast of North America. The principal village was in what is now Hampton, VA. The Kecoughtan were a part of the larger Powhatan Confederacy. Many institutions and areas are named after the Kecoughtan Tribe, including Kecoughtan High School.

Brown, having fulfilled the ordination requirements of the Presbyterian Church, (U.S.A.) and the Presbytery, and having received the call of God to serve as the covenant associate pastor at KirkWood Presbyterian Church, Yorktown, be ordained as a minister of the Word and Sacrament.

2.On May 5, 2025, approved the covenant and agreement, including terms, for Candidate for Ministry Mary V. Brown, at KirkWood Presbyterian Church, Yorktown, if ordained as a minister of the Word and Sacrament.

3.On May 5, 2025, approved the honorable retirement of the Reverend James A. Goodbow, as of July 22, 2025. 4.On June 3, 2025, approved the Commissioned Pastor (CP) Covenant between the session of First Church, Virginia Beach and CP Randolph C. DuVall effective April 21, 2025, through April 21, 2026. 5.On June 3, 2025, dismissed (with regret) the Rev. Elizabeth Grace "Liza" Hendricks to the Presbytery of Mid-Kentucky, Louisville, KY. 6.On June 3, 2025, approved the Parish Associate Agreement between First Church, Virginia Beach and the Rev. Dr. Richard J. Keever effective April 1, 2025, through March 31, 2026. 7.On June 3, 2025, the sabbatical request from the Rev. Boone D. Clayton was approved, from November 3, 2025, to February 1, 2026. 8.On June 3, 2025, approved the salary adjustment request (max \$60,000) for the associate pastor position at King's Grant Presbyterian Church, Virginia Beach. It was previously approved by the Session of King's Grant Church. 9.On June 3, 2025, sustained the examination of Candidate for Ministry Mary V. Brown to be ordained as a minister of the Word and Sacrament. 10.0n June 3, 2025, agreed to recommend to the Moderator and Presbytery the dissolution of the Administrative Commission to Knox Church, Norfolk. The motion will be placed in the Stated Clerk report in paragraph C. ADMINISTRATIVE COMMISSIONS. 11.On June 3, 2025, appointed the Reverend **Brian H. Harroff** the moderator of Knox Church, Norfolk. 12.On June 3, 2025, recommended to the Presbytery Council that an Administrative Commission be established for Stone House Presbyterian Church, Toano whose main purpose will be to help the church get its financial business in order.

ACTIONS:

#### At the stated meeting on May 14, 2025:

- 1.Approved request from the new PEVA Worship Planning Team for \$1500.00 and a new line item created.
  2.Approved Ruling Rev. Helen "Lou"
- Ventura (Class of 2027) and RE Lorri Richardson (Class of 2028) become authorized signers for the New Covenant Trust and that Rev. Dr. Melissa Sumner Long is added on the Presbytery account to receive reports and be able to talk to them about PEVA accounts.
- 3.PEVA Office officially moved to a new office at Royster Memorial Presbyterian Church at 6901 Newport Avenue, Norfolk, VA. The Trustees approved the listing with S.L. Nusbaum Realty Company for 801 Loudoun Avenue, as is, at \$485,000 as advised by the real estate agent.

# At the stated meeting on June 12, 2025:

- 1.An offer was received for purchase of property at 801 Loudon Ave. for \$400,000. The Stated Clerk requested to counter the offer for \$440,000.00, which was accepted by the potential buyer. The potential buyer has agreed to remove language about closing before August 1st and to correct the corporate name on the agreement.
- 2.Reviewed the Terms of Call for the Rev. Dr. Melissa Sumner Long as General Presbyter for the Presbytery. The Presbytery will vote on them at the July Stated Presbytery meeting by ballot.
  3.Small Church Grant requests from Grace Covenant and Hilton Presbyterian Churches were tabled to July 10, 2025, meeting.

## At the stated meeting on July 10, 2025:

1.Approved the Small Church Grant request of Stone House Presbyterian Church, Toano, for \$10.000.00, to have gutters installed, water heaters replaced, drainage infrastructure

- installed in the playground, and mold remediation.
- 2.Approved the Small Church Grant request of Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church, Virginia Beach, for \$7.000.00, to replace the flooring in four classrooms used by the pre-school.

  3.Approved the Small Church Grant request of Hilton Presbyterian Church, Newport News, for \$5.500.00 to make improvements to the sanctuary.
- 4. Approved 0% loan up to \$80,000, with no term, for HVAC replacement for Calvin Presbyterian Church to be supported by invoices submitted to the Presbytery. The loan is to be partially repaid by funds received from previously restricted funds. The provided funds may not be used for personnel costs.

#### NARRATIVE REPORT

HUNGER GRANTS: The Compassion Peace & Justice Team reviewed and voted on two grants by email in June. Greenbrier PC and First Portsmouth PC each received Church Community Hunger Grants in the amount of \$1,000.00 each.

2025 PEVA WIDE CEREAL CAMPAIGN: The goal for 2025 bowls in 2025 has been reached! PEVA Collected 3,001 servings of cereal, oatmeal, and grits in May and June of 2025. Children who rely on free or reduced-price breakfast and lunch at school often go without enough to eat

during the summer at home. You and your church can step up to the bowl by collecting cereal and oatmeal, and grits to provide breakfast for children throughout Hampton Roads. Special thanks to those churches and individuals that participated.

FOOD CLOSET, PANTRY, OUTREACH, CREATION CARE & GOOD NEWS AROUND PEVA: MATTHEW 25 IN ACTION: BELOW are a few things that the Hunger Action Advocate is aware of within the presbytery.

- Hidenwood PC Hidenwood holds a blood drive once a month. Their next drive is July 15, from noon - 6 pm. Hidenwood also runs a Food Closet Ministry. They receive referrals from the United Way of the Virginia Peninsula's First Call program. Hidenwood is entirely dependent on donations from the congregation, and their preschool donates peanut butter and jelly as an offering during their chapel time twice monthly. Hidenwood's Mission Committee purchases perishables for holiday meals and keeps the food pantry stocked with staples. They have an annual Rise Against hunger multicultural event that packs 100,000 meals.
- •Hilton PC Hilton's volunteers helped their neighbors at Hilton Baptist Church by serving dinner at their community dinner and open pantry, on June 27. They are lending a loving hand on July 27 and August 29 also. Hilton PC collects nonperishable food items year-round and gives them to partner local organizations such as Virginia Peninsula Foodbank and THRIVE. Hilton PC volunteers give their time to TRIVE's market especially for the market late hours. The Market is a free grocerystyle food pantry where you choose all your own items including fresh, frozen, and shelf-stable foods. It is open to residents of Newport News, Hampton, Yorktown, and Poquoson. There are no income limits for the market; however, residents are restricted to just one visit every 30 days. Did you know that THRIVE assists clients apply for SNAP (food stamps), Childcare Assistance, Medicaid and other benefits?
- •Denbigh United PC Denbigh United held a "clothing & more" giveaway for their community on May 25. Many volunteers came together to make this event a

success. Not only are they helping those that need it, but they are also making an impact on the environment. That unwanted clothing found a new home and did not end up in the landfill! Their next event will be Sunday, August 17, 2025. On May 5, several DUPC faithful volunteers provided snacks and drinks to the students at CNU during their stressful exams. DUPC also collected diapers for ECHO Family Care Partners.
