# LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT RE Jill Keifer

(Royster Memorial)

The Presbytery acknowledged that it was gathered on the traditional territory of the Chesepian tribe, part of the Algonquin language group that resided on the East Coast of North America. The principal village was in what is now the Sewell's Point neighborhood of Norfolk. The Chesepian tribe were a part of the larger Powhatan Confederacy and were subjugated by the Powhatans. The Chesapeake Bay is named after this tribe.

SALE OF CHURCH REAL ESTATE

On August 27, 2025, the **Presbyterian Center**, 801 Loudoun Avenue, Portsmouth, was sold to Sessoms, LLC, Portsmouth, a counseling service. The sale price was \$392,000 and after fees and commissions the Presbytery received \$366,000.

Reports on Administrative Commissions are a section of the stated clerk's report. An Administrative Commission (Commission) for the Stone House Presbyterian Church, Toano was approved by the Presbytery on July 22, 2025, with the purpose of reviewing the church' finances for the Session and the church's Finance Committee, and to assure compliance with Book of Order.

When a successor is nominated by the Council, RE Tamm will conduct an orderly turnover of the office and then resign.

# COMMISSION ON MINISTRY (COM)

Report to the Presbytery
Reverend Charles M. Tucker, moderator.
MOTION: That the Presbytery sustained
the ordination homily of Candidate for
Ministry Andrea Alvord Wood, as
presented at St Barnabas Jericho Church,
West Oxford, England, United Kingdom, on
October 5, 2025.

MOTION: Candidate for Ministry Andrea Alvord Wood, having fulfilled the ordination requirements of the Presbyterian Church, (U.S.A.) and the Presbytery, and having received the call

of God to serve as an evangelist in the United Kingdom, be ordained as a minister of the Word and Sacrament.

MOTION: The Committee on Ministry recommended to the Presbytery of Eastern Virginia the following policy regarding elder commissioners:

- 1. The Presbytery strongly encourages each congregation to elect at least one ruling elder under the age of 50, who will have additional responsibility to serve as commissioner at a Stated Meeting at least once each calendar year. This will be a means of intentionally developing younger leadership.
- 2.Each session should attempt (or aim) to have no individual ruling; elders serve as a commissioner to more than two stated meetings per calendar year.

  3.We encourage every elder to attend at least one meeting during their term—to be informed, connected, and reminded that they are part of the connectional Presbyterian Church, (USA).

Rationale: Over time, our Presbytery has observed a trend: the majority of elected commissioners are older adults. This reflects the deep faithfulness and steady leadership of long-serving elders, whose presence has shaped and sustained our congregations. We are grateful for their wisdom and commitment. At the same time, we recognize an imbalance-and it is not a new one. Even during Rev. Elizabeth Grace "Liza" Hendricks' tenure, we explored ways to increase younger participation, including changing meeting times. Despite those efforts, younger elders remain largely absent from our meetings.

- 2.On August 5, 2025, received as a minister member of the Presbytery, the Reverend **Geneviéve Beauchamp**, from the Peace River Presbytery, Port Charlotte, FL.
- 3.On August 5, 2025, approved the Reverend Geneviéve Beauchamp, to serve as the designated pastor to the yoked

congregations of Francis Makemie Church, Accomac, and Naomi Makemie Church, Onancock.

4.On August 5, 2025, approved the designated pastor covenant and agreement for the Reverend Geneviéve Beauchamp and the sessions of Francis Makemie Church and Naomi Makemie Church.

5.On August 5, 2025, received as a minister member, contingent upon her ordination as a minister of the Word and Sacrament by the Grace Presbytery, Irving, TX, Ms. **Kailey Noel Stephens**. 6.On August 5, 2025, approved Ms. Kailey Noel Stephens as the associate pastor of King's Grant Church, Virginia Beach, contingent upon her ordination as a minister.

7.On August 5, 2025, approved the covenant and terms of call between the congregation of King's Grant Church, Virginia Beach and Ms. Kailey Noel Stephens.

8.On August 5, 2025, upon the recommendation of the Stated Clerk, approved a recommended 2.7% increase in effective salary, with a minimum effective salary of \$56,819.00 for ministers of the Word and Sacrament in congregational ministry.

9.On August 5, 2025, approved a proposal to pay the health care dues to the Board of Pensions, for congregations that cannot otherwise afford a pastor. The maximum grant is \$18,500 a year for two years.

Actions for the August 14, 2025, meeting:

- •Trustees approved transferring \$38,383.83 from PEVA Undesignated to the Small Church Assistance line to cover the negative amount of \$3,383.83 and an additional \$25,000.00 cushion for future grants. The trustees instructed the Business Administrator to proceed with the transfer as approved.
- •Trustees disapproved the Small Church Grant that Christ Presbyterian Church, Virginia Beach submitted for the roof and referred them to the Committee on Ministry for a discernment process and conversation. The General Presbyter will contact the pulpit supply minister and Clerk of Session of Christ Presbyterian Church and the Committee on Ministry on this matter.
- •Trustees approved the concept and financial support to small congregations to support the Board of Pensions dues that congregations must pay to the Board for pension, death and disability, and health insurance of up to \$1,000,000.00 from investments.

# Actions for the September 11, 2025, meeting:

•The sale of 801 Loudoun Avenue took place on August 27, 2025. The Trustees approved the total net proceeds of \$366,285.13 from the sale of the property will go into the PEVA Undesignated account for future use, aligning with the existing voted authority.

## NARRATIVE REPORT HUNGER GRANTS:

MOTION: The Hunger Ministry Team recommended to Presbytery that the Hunger Action Advocate Covenant between the Presbytery of Eastern Virginia Inc. and the Presbyterian Hunger Program of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) be approved.

Note: Proposed covenant requests PCUSA funds to help support the PEVA Hunger Action Enabler in the amount of \$5,500 in 2026. It also outlines the PEVA CPJ - hunger advocacy and ministry program and provides a summary of projects, goals, people reached, and communication means

related to the PEVA Presbyterian Hunger Program and the Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP).

MOTION: That the report of the Hunger Ministry Team be printed in the minutes of this meeting.

### ACTIONS TAKEN:

Approved by email in the month of August a Church Community Hunger Grant for Simonsdale's PC (Food Pantry Ministry) in the amount of \$1,000. Simonsdale provides a bag full of groceries per month to clients that are food-challenged due to various circumstances. This ministry serves approximately 40 people per month. This grant will assist them to expand their ministry and offer fresh produce/fruit and some frozen products to those who receive non-perishable groceries. They have already purchased a stand-alone freezer that can accommodate some items.

At the stated meeting on September, 20, 2025 several hunger grants were approved such as Church Community Hunger Grants for First United PC (Lindenwood, Park Place Outreach), Lynnhaven PC (Food Pantry Ministry) , and Second PC Norfolk (Feed my Sheep), in the amount of \$1,000 each and Nickel -A- Meal Grant for Community Portsmouth (Feeding the Unhoused of Downtown Portsmouth, Community Garden, Thanksgiving & Christmas Baskets), Community Hampton (A Nights Welcome, Langley Community Site Ministry), First Portsmouth (Simple Sunday morning breakfast) and First United (Food Ministry Villa Heights Outreach) in the amount of \$1,250 each. Due to the ongoing needs of so many in our communities, many churches continue to see a rise in requests for assistance from those in their beloved community struggling with food insecurity and other needs. Local Food banks have also seen roughly a 35% increase in those seeking assistance.

### NARRATIVE REPORT

Migrant Farm Workers and Seasonal Agriculture Workers 2025 Season Overview: The Truck was packed the night of July 28th, full of 204 Food Kits, 104 Hygiene Kits, 72 Bottle of Laundry Soap, 79 Packs of Baby Wipes, 2,448 Diapers, 215 Bags/Boxes of Clothing, Shoes, Hats Extra Toiletries and Food, Children's Books, 21 School Bags filles with School Supplies, 72 Food Lion/21 Visa Gift Cards ranging from \$15-20 and the trip to deliver took place on July 29th.

\$500 was disbursed to the East Coast Head Start Project for the two centers on the shore for the Family Emergency Fund. An additional \$2,000 will be sent as approved by CPJ.

\$400 was disbursed to the Legal Aid Justice Center to use for their work with the workers.

\$300 was disbursed to the Dos Santos Food Pantry. They provide healthy, culturally appropriate food to the immigrant and agricultural worker communities in Accomack and Northampton Counties of Virginia's Eastern Shore.

An additional 22 (\$20) Food Lion Cards and 3 (\$15) Food Lion Cards from the Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church's Men Group was sent to the Centers in early September.

An additional 1 (\$50) Food Lion Card from the Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church's Men Group for an urgent need in early October.

Presbytery received a wonderful thank you card from LaShaundra Blake and Rhonda Strand, directors of two Eastern Shore Head Start programs.

FOOD CLOSET, PANTRY, OUTREACH, CREATION CARE & GOOD NEWS AROUND PEVA: MATTHEW 25 IN ACTION: September was Hunger Action Month, and your support is making a world of difference. What a privilege it is to serve as the hands and feet of Christ, impacting hunger in our communities and around the world.

Royster PC - Once a month a group of faithful volunteers make about 125 sandwiches and take them to St. Columba. They also participate in Let's Make a Difference' group through educational meetings, as well as volunteering to take school supplies and birthday tributes to some local schools who serve at-risk students. Royster partner with Granby HS and provide snacks, personal and hygiene items, school supplies, and other needs for the students and staff. Royster Memorial also hosts 'Second Crossing' which teaches special ed

Highschool students on how to cook and serve a meal. They continue to assist those who are experiencing food insecurity through a robust food pantry ministry, open three days a week, that serves 100 families weekly.

Yorkminster PC & Kirkwood PC - 115 volunteers, hailing from our Yorkminster PC and Kirkwood PC, Northside Church of Christ and Yorkminster PC's Cub Scout and Boy Scout Packs packed 20,088 meals. at a recent Rise Against Hunger event. Providence PC - had a Rise Against Hunger 2025 meal packing event that was a huge success. Over 15,300 meals packed in just a few hours!! What a privilege it is to serve as the hands and feet of Christ, impacting hunger around the world.

Hilton PC - has had a partnership with THRIVE Peninsula, Hilton PC volunteers give their time and or resources at the THRIVE MARKET. Mid-September thru October Hitlon PC collected Hispanic food for THRIVE's new market honoring culture and nourish with dignity for the growing number of Hispanic clients they serve.

Saint Andrew PC - had a Rise Against Hunger event in late September. In just a couple of hours, 70 volunteers packed 15,000 meals.

First United PC & Royster PC - First United PC and Royster Memorial PC have combined for several book studies in the past few years. They are in the middle of a fall book series right now reading and discussing Poverty in the Promised Land by Walter Brueggemann. This book refers to, and uses, Matthew Desmond's book Poverty by America (which was highlighted at the July presbytery meeting. PEVA's CPJ Team encourages others to read the book which may also lead to faithful action.

At the stated meeting on September, 20, 2025 approved a Peacemaking Grant for Second PC for their Peace on Earth LAUNCH (Learning, Access, Unity, Nutrition, Career and Health) Christmas event in the amount of \$1,000.

At the stated meeting on September, 20, 2025 approved guidance that any gift for the Peace and Global Witness Offering under \$100 sent directly to the national office (instead of PEVA) can be retained by the national office for that purpose and the Mid-Council (PEVA) does not need the 25% forwarded.
