Last Monday for national science week we brought in Atomic Tom who demonstrated exciting experiments to the whole school in a special assembly and then delivered workshops to our year 1 and 3 classes. As a school we continue to focus on delivering practical and exciting experiments within our science lessons.

Our year 3 and 6 classes have completed their 6week dance sessions today with Miss Sophie our dance coach. The children have worked hard over the past weeks to put on their performance and have been taught key elements of dance through their routines. After Easter years 1 and 2 will get to dance with our expert which the school buys in through the sports premium funding.



Tennis Tom has continued to work with our reception children on developing tennis skills and the children have been brilliant. They now have rackets in their hands and are controlling the tennis ball. Tom is employed again via the Sports Premium by the school and has been now worked with every class in the school. He will continue to work with our children throughout the summer term.



Mr Howells Ukulele lessons for year 3 and 5 have also been going really well and will continue until May- we hope to be able to put on another performance to parents so the children can show what they have learnt.



Our Forest School provision also continues to be very popular with the children. Mrs Oakley delivers an excellent forest school curriculum and again will have worked with all children across the school be the end of the school year.

Our Year 6 children recently completed some more SATs practice tests and have really impressed us with their scores. The children's hard work and concentration is really paying off.

The Year 6 SATs week begins on Monday 13th May and our year 6 pupils should be feeling confident to go and do their best. A SATs meeting for parents has been arranged on Tuesday 23rd April straight after school.

This week we took a team for a key-stage 2 hockey quick sticks competition at Moulton College. Our sports coaches (we pay for on a Friday) have practiced with the children over the past weeks and this has definitely supported the children with their enjoyment in school competitions.

A recent pupil wellbeing survey of the whole school showed that 97% said they felt safe at school, 94% enjoyed school and 99% said they had someone they trusted that they could talk to at KVPS.



Good luck to our Hotshots basketball players who have their County Championship Finals this Saturday at Danes Camp Leisure Centre. KVPS will be competing against twenty-four other schools that qualified to attempt to become county champions. Play well team, enjoy it and we look forward to hearing all about it in Monday's assembly.
