I am thrilled to announce that the school (when we return in 2024) will be full at 210 pupils with all classes having 30 pupils.

Fire Safety

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 had a visit from the Northamptonshire Fire Service this week. They learnt about how they can keep safe when at home, at school and out in public places and they learnt how to 'stop, drop and roll' to stop fire spreading if their clothes catch fire. They found out more about the role of the firefighter and saw some of the protective clothing that firefighters wear. Year 1 and 2 were able to make comparisons between firefighters today and firefighters around the time of the Great Fire of London as they have been learning about this during the autumn term.
