# Activity Codes and Measurements

Activity	Code	Measurement
Adopt-An-Access	AAA	Number of agreements - adopters help maintain a stream or lake access; this is a report of their signed and completed agreement.
Advocacy	ADV	Number of events - teams who advocate through our non-profit partner, Stream Teams United; they comment on legislative proposals and city, county, or state regulations impacting water resources.
Agency	AGE	Number of events - teams who help with agency special projects; they help with aquatic stocking and species surveys.
Volunteer Appreciation	ASC	Number of trips - teams who host volunteer appreciation events or send thank you notes.
Education	EDU	Number of events - teams who attend workshops, trainings, or presentations.
Educational Project	EDUP	Number of participants - teams who give public presentations; they host booths and give demonstrations at schools, fairs, and festivals. This includes projects, displays, and presentations.
Missouri Forestkeepers Network	FOR	Number of trips - teams who monitor or inventory through the Missouri Forestkeepers Network; they focus on tree care and management.
Grant	GRT	Number of projects - teams who submit applications for grants; they must also report grants received.
Habitat Improvement	HAI	Number of projects - teams who improve native habitat types, including greenway projects; they maintain native vegetation plantings, artificial habitat, or maintain public hiking trails.
Invasive Species Monitoring	ISM	Number of trips - teams who monitor aquatic invasive species; they monitor zebra mussels, hydrilla, Chinese mystery snails, and rusty crayfish.
Invasive Species Removal	ISR	Number of square feet - teams who removed vegetative invasive species; they remove bush honeysuckle, autumn olive, winter creeper, and callery pear.
Litter Pickups	LPU	Number of trash - teams who remove red, green, or blue litter bags, tires, semi-or-tractor tires, or other trash in pounds; they can also report as total tonnage removed.
Media Contact	MED	Number of interviews - teams who are interviewed, write articles, or write blogs about their team.
Meetings	MTG	Number of attendees - teams who host meetings; they can be internal meetings with team members or meetings with the general public.
Mentoring and Recruiting	MEN	Number of contacts - teams who recruit or mentor new team members.
Monofilament	MRP	Number of ounces - teams who collect monofilament line to be recycled or disposed of.
Other	OTH	Number of projects - teams who help in a way that is not covered under another activity code. Please describe your activity in detail.
Photo Point Monitoring	PPM	Number of photos - teams who take photos of a stream; they are taken as a part of restoration project monitoring or to document change over time.
Planning for Events	PLN	Number of projects - teams who request supplies and plan events in advance <b>MUST</b> submit this report; they include the date of planned activity and how many service volunteers they expect to attend to receive supplies.
Planted Trees	PLT	Number of trees - teams who plant trees; they will have an approved tree plan with their local forester to receive free trees from Missouri Department of Conservation.
Storm Drain Stenciling	SDS	Number of drains - teams who label storm drains with stencils or markers; they work with local municipalities.
Stormwater Mitigation	NPS	Number of projects - teams who help install and maintain rain gardens, rain barrels, and green roofs; they help mitigate non-point source pollution.
Stream Stabilization Project	SSP	Number of projects - teams who help install riprap, cedar tree revetments, and plant streambank willows; they help mitigate streambank erosion.
Water Quality Monitoring	WQM	Number of trips to individual monitoring sites - one trip can include doing multiple data sheets.
Watershed Mapping	WAT	Number of trips - teams who outline their surface watershed on a topographic map; some teams do advanced watershed mapping, including dye testing.
