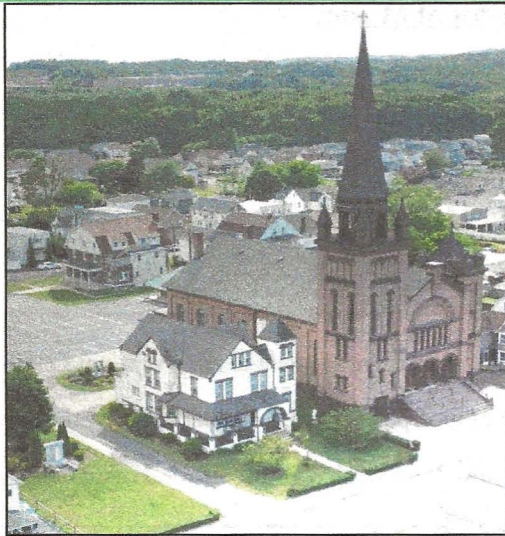

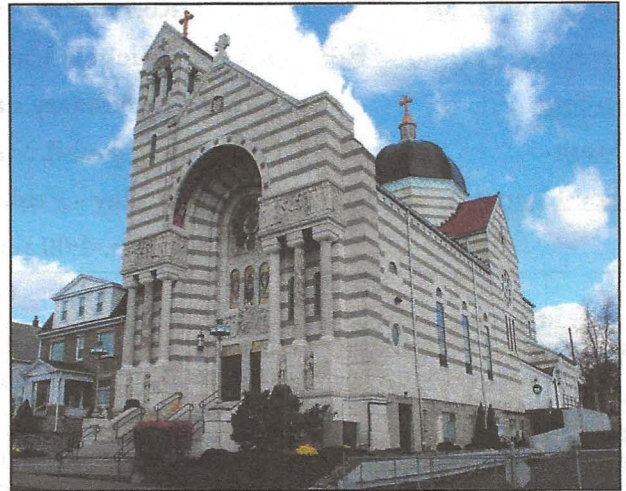

PRAYER TO ST. MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL: On October 13, 1884, during Mass in his private Vatican Chapel, Pope Leo XIII had a vision involving Saint Michael the Archangel where he witnessed Satan and his demons released from Hell, followed by Saint Michael casting them back in. The vision also included a prophecy about the 20th century, with events like wars, immorality, genocide, and apostasy. In response, Leo XIII wrote the Prayer to St. Michael. If you do not know this prayer, learn it and pray it often:

Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle.

Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil.

May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host,

by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits

who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

This mass is offered for the families and friends of those who have died in tragedy, especially through murder, suicide or accident. All persons who have lost a loved one through tragic and traumatic death are invited to this liturgy. Mass will be televised on CTV and livestreamed on the diocesan website, www.dioceseofscranton.org. Names of deceased loved ones will be inscribed in the Book of Remembrance. NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at (570) 862-7551.
