


U.S. BISHOPS ISSUE "SPECIAL MESSAGE" ON IMMIGRATION:

"To our immigrant brothers and sisters, we stand with you in your suffering, since, when one member suffers, all suffer (cf. 1 Cor 12:26). You are not alone!

In this dialogue, we will continue to advocate for meaningful immigration reform."
