If you haven’t already, please get the free Studybugs app, or register on the Studybugs website, and use it to tell us whenever your child’s ill and unable to attend school.



What does 'empathy' mean?




Empathy means "feeling with someone."

This is when you recognise another person's feelings and try to understand and support them without judgement.

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What does 'empathy' mean?

Why is it important to show empathy?



How do you do it?

Imagine your friend is telling you about a difficult situation in their life - maybe their parents have decided to get divorced, their pet isn't well or they are feeling nervous about attending a new club.

What can you do?



Step 1: Listen

How do you show that you are listening to the person sharing their thoughts and feelings?

Make sure you are really listening, and not just waiting for your turn to talk - there's a difference!



Step 2: Think about how the other person is feeling.

What zone or emotion are they experiencing? What do their words and body language tell you?

Are they ok in that zone, or are they finding it difficult?

What tools might help them?



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Step 3: Be supportive.


Use a gentle voice and kind words and actions that show the person you have listened and that you care.



Optional Step 4: Give advice.

Sometimes, we just want to vent and get things off our chest and don't want any advice. Other times, we would like help from our friends.

You can ask your friend, "Are we trying to solve the problem together or do you just need to let it out?"



Let them lead the conversation.

Your Turn

Take it in turns to share how you are feeling and why. Speak for one minute as the talker, and then switch and be the listener for one minute.

Which was easier? Which was harder? Why do you think?

This Week:

Showing empathy is part of being respectful. It means we are taking notice of others around us and not always thinking about ourselves. Try and show empathy to the other people in your lives (this includes the adults!).

House points will be awarded to those who are showing empathy to others; this includes listening, being supportive, advising where needed and being respectful.

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about TOY SCALPING, FAKES & SCAMS

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

Online scalping is when individuals or groups use automated software (bots) to bulk-buy high-demand items – such as gaming consoles, concert tickets, limited-edition trainers, or exclusive merchandise – with the intention of reselling them at vastly inflated prices. It's a fast-moving online trend that can frustrate young consumers and expose them to misleading practices or financial harm. As this unethical tactic grows, it's important to help children and young people understand how scalping works and how to navigate it responsibly.

FINANCIAL PRESSURE AND MANIPULATION

Scalpers create artificial scarcity by buying up large quantities of stock before the public has a fair chance to purchase. This drives up demand and pushes prices to extreme levels. Young people are particularly vulnerable to spending more than they can afford for fear of missing out entirely.

EXPLORATION OF FANDOMS

Scalping often targets popular releases with strong fan bases, knowing that toy followers are willing to pay a premium. Young people may place huge value on owning certain items limited to their favourite artists, sports teams or games, making them more likely to accept unfair prices or questionable sellers.

ACCESSING UNSAFE WEBSITES

In the rush to secure rare items, young people might click through to unverified sellers, online marketplaces with little consumer protection, or even sites designed specifically to harvest personal and financial data. This can expose them to fraud, malware, and identity theft.

NORMALISING UNETHICAL BEHAVIOUR

Some influencers and online communities present scalping as a clever money-making scheme rather than an exploitative one. This can normalise dishonest behaviour and encourage children to emulate business and opportunistic profiteering for younger audiences.

RISK OF SCAMS OR COUNTERFEIT GOODS

Not every high-priced resale is legitimate. Unscrupulous sellers may take payment for goods that are never delivered or are fake. Even if a product is real, it may look authentic in photo but turn out to be of poor quality or completely different from what was advertised.

REINFORCING INEQUALITY

Scalping makes already expensive items even less accessible, particularly for lower-income families. Children may feel excluded from trends or shared experiences with friends if their family cannot meet the inflated prices, which can lead to feelings of isolation and disappointment.

Advice for Parents & Educators

TALK ABOUT ONLINE FAIRNESS

Use existing as an opportunity to discuss fairness, consumer ethics, and how some people exploit markets for profit. Encouraging children to think critically about whether they truly need an item – and at what cost – can help them make more considered decisions.

SUPPORT INFORMED PURCHASING

Show children how to check seller credibility, read independent reviews, and verify whether a site is secure before making any payment. Knowing how to spot red flags, such as unrealistic promises or missing crucial details, can prevent costly mistakes.

ENCOURAGE PATIENCE OVER IMPULSE

Remind young people to wait the official release or future releases instead of paying over the odds. Many products come back into circulation, and patience can save significant amounts of money while reducing the likelihood of falling victim to scams.

SET SPENDING BOUNDARIES

Establish clear rules for online spending, including limits on pre-paid cards, gifting gift cards, and online wallets. Discuss the real-world value of money spent on digital or collector's items as children understand the long-term impact of their purchases.



Learning this week!

Year 3

The Christmas spirit has well and truly arrived in Year 3!

Our fantastic children have treated us (and several audiences) this week to a medley of seasonal songs. In classes, the children sang their hearts out and performed their poem brilliantly. The year group rendition of Feliz Navidad was a highlight and the confidence and enjoyment displayed was a delight to see!

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
In Science this week, we have been testing different surfaces to expand our knowledge of friction, identifying different types of magnets, explaining why magnets attract and repel and testing objects to discover whether they are magnetic.

We have been solving word problems in maths using the bar model, making sure that we read the question carefully so that we can identify the important information, calculate the answer and solve the problem. Resilience was definitely on display as these are the most complex word problems we have met so far this year!

One week to go until your first term in the Juniors is complete, Year 3 – how time has flown and what skills and learning you have gained!



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Year 4

Year 4 have had a great few weeks, travelling around the world in 80 days for our topic. We've researched different countries - their capitals, population and cultures. In computing, the children have made powerpoints about their favourite countries, using research online and looking at atlases.

In Maths, we've been looking at division - using the 'bus stop' method to divide three digit numbers by one digit numbers and continuing to do timed tests where the children work towards winning a star or certificate. In our PE lessons, we have continued to develop our hockey skills while working in pairs in gymnastics to balance confidently.

This term, our Science lessons have been about 'Living things and their habitats – Conservation.' We conducted an interesting experiment about pollution, demonstrating how much dirtier the air is by the London Road compared to in the classroom.

In Music they have been learning about the roots of rock and roll, singing 'Rock around the clock' and dancing to the hand jive!

Needless to say, they're all looking forward to the holidays and a final week learning through Christmas themed activities!

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Year 5

What an exciting, busy week Year 5 has had! 🎉

In DT, we had so much fun creating amazing doodlers using circuits and motors to draw fun patterns. We needed to use a lot of problem solving skills and creativity, but the final doodlers were great!

We were also treated to a fantastic performance from our wonderful drama club, showcasing their incredible talents! We were so pleased to be invited to see their show, and they have worked so hard to put on a brilliant afternoon for us!

The week continued with an enriching Geography day, where we explored our local area on a walk, followed by engaging activities. We had special visits from Eastwood Academy, where we were taught how to use microscopes, discovered what happens to our water, and discussed what we should flush down the toilet. We even delved into the fascinating world of microorganisms!

To top it all off, we celebrated Christmas Jumper Day with a delightful pantomime as our end-of-term treat! 🎉



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

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
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
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
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Year 6

Year 6 have had an exceptionally busy and exciting week filled with creativity, learning and teamwork. In English, the children have been planning and writing persuasive letters to businesses from the perspective of elfkins (young elves) who are trying to gain work experience before becoming real elves. Their imaginative applications have included placements in toy shops, bakeries, air traffic control and even petting farms! The children have shown fantastic creativity while also developing important persuasive writing skills.

In Computing, the children have been finalising their websites about famous children of the Windrush generation. They have learnt how to add photos, videos and maps, as well as how to insert both external and internal links. They have also thought carefully about audience, layout and usability, ensuring their websites are easy to navigate and engaging for visitors.





Year 6 should be incredibly proud of everything they have achieved – their effort, creativity and teamwork have truly shone this week.



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
Achievement Awards

Please encourage good attendance and ensure your child is in every day.

Important facts about school attendance:

- There are 190 school days each academic year
- There are 175 other days for holidays and other activities
- The national average for school attendance is 95%
- 90% attendance represents 1 day non-attendance a fortnight
- 80% attendance represents 1 day non-attendance a week

At CHJS, we always strive for 100% attendance. We understand that illness occurs from time to time but ask that you support your child's learning and us a school by ensuring your child is in school every day and on time.

Our aim is that every child is in school every session, every day so we can give them the best education we can. Attendance is a key indicator to a child's success so we will be looking to be even better every week! We will be focusing on ensuring attendance is as good as it can be next year.

What YOU must do:

Try to telephone the school before 8.30am each day of your child's absence.

Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters.

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If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival.

Have a backup plan for if your child misses transport, call on a family member, neighbour or friend.

If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance then talk to us as a first step so we can help!

What WE will do:

Check your child's attendance every day.

Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.

Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned.

If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a welfare home visit.
