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Free school meal (FSM) eligibility

From September 2026, the Department for Education (DfE) will expand free school meal (FSM) eligibility to include all pupils from households receiving Universal Credit. This creates two categories:

- **Targeted FSM:** Based on the existing £7,400 income threshold
 - **Expanded FSM:** Covers meals only for pupils in households receiving Universal Credit who do not qualify for Targeted FSM
-

Free school meals are available to pupils who are, or whose parents are, in receipt of:

- Universal Credit
 - Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
-

A pupil is only eligible if:

- A claim has been made, and
 - Eligibility has been verified by the school or local authority
-

Households may also qualify if they:

- Receive income-related Employment and Support Allowance
 - Receive the guarantee element of Pension Credit
 - Meet criteria set out in separate guidance for **families with no recourse to public funds**

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Under the expanded scheme from September 2026, Southend-on-Sea City Council advises applying after 15 June 2026:

Applying for free school meals / Southend-on-Sea City Council

We strongly encourage eligible families to apply.

- Southend-on-Sea City Council cannot backdate claims to cover unpaid or previously paid costs*
 - Foster children are not usually eligible, as fostering allowances are intended to cover meal costs*

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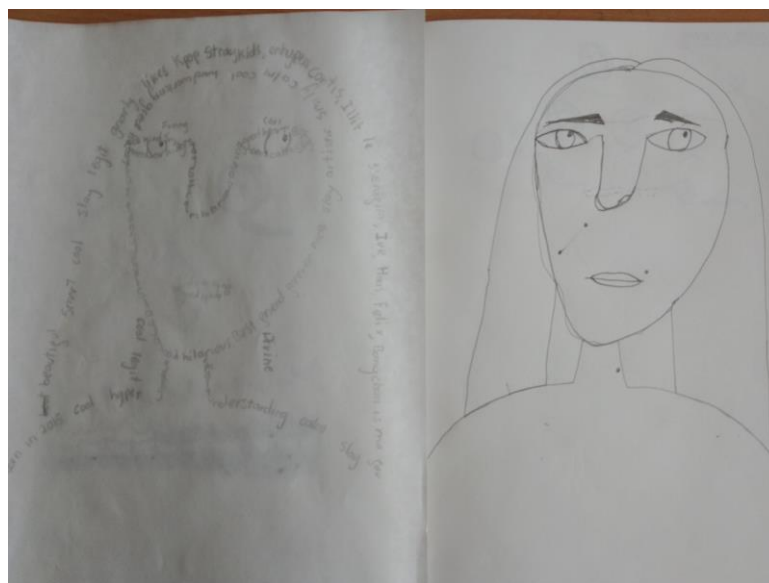


Year 5

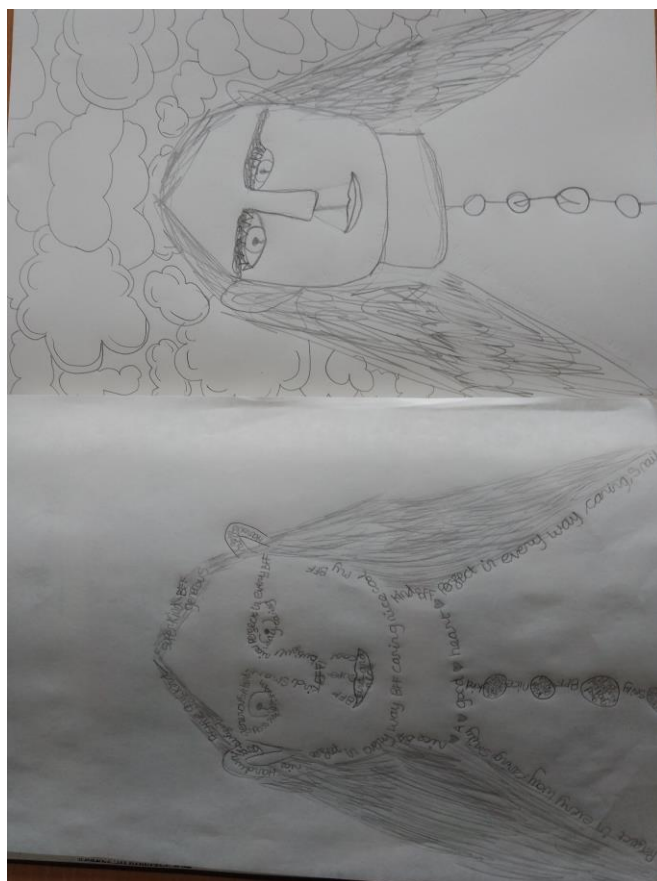

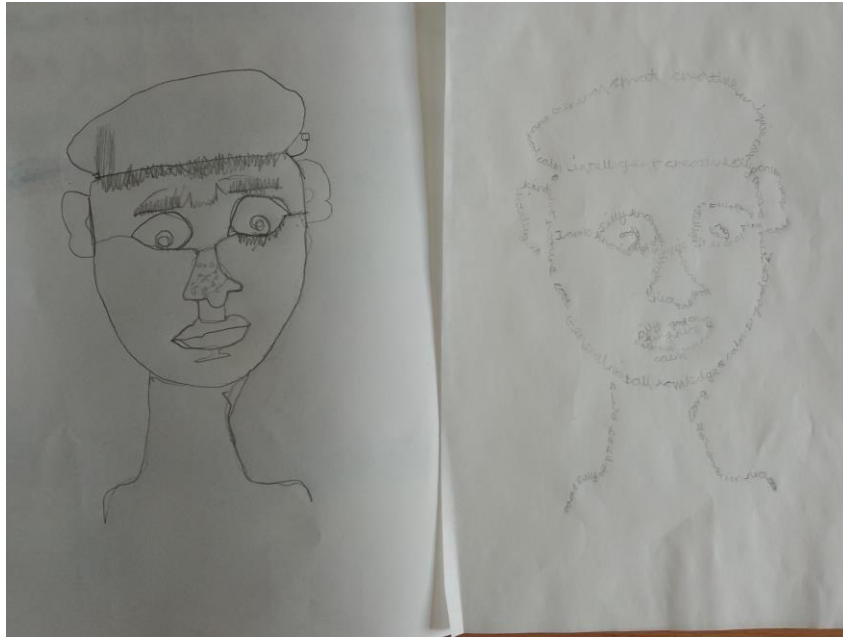
We are incredibly proud of their creativity, collaboration and positivity—well done, Year 5!

My wonderful family,

Rhetorical question: How is my son? I have been missing looking at Benjamin's face. I often find myself day dreaming about the cozy nights at home: playing cards at the dinner table, eating dinner with you and Benjamin, and making ^{miniature} model cars with him Benjamin. May you send me some ~~photographs~~ ^{miniature} photographs from home? Thinking about you keeps me strong; I wouldn't be here if not thinking about depending on you.

At around 8:00*PM me and my mates started to exchange gifts and laughs until we realised that there was no shooting or explosions. Instead of loud noises, there was only faint german singing. ~~it~~ ^{laughing and cheers} Even though it was in german,

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Colon we recognised the stars. Silent night.
Before we knew it, we all joined in and it was the most
best I felt since it started the war. After the song, we all
let out a sigh of relief and some German said "No war
tomorrow!" and we slept in peaceful silence.
I woke up to, at last, silence, no shooting, no
explosions, nothing. Then, at about 8:00 in the morning,
I heard it. "Aye! German on No-man's Land!" I
thought they were joking but there was, although,
it wasn't holding a gun or explosives with him
but just his hands, in the air! Me wanting
to end the war - walked out and shook his hand.
All of a sudden, more soldiers walked out
and said "Truce for Christmas!" We showed
them our children, they showed theirs, we brought
our gifts, they brought ours. Gifts until

someone kicked a football and we played for hours.
We kept playing until we heard the gun firing,
we shook hands and went our separate ways.
But now, I have to end my letter to you, I would
love to continue but they are doing the final call
for letters.

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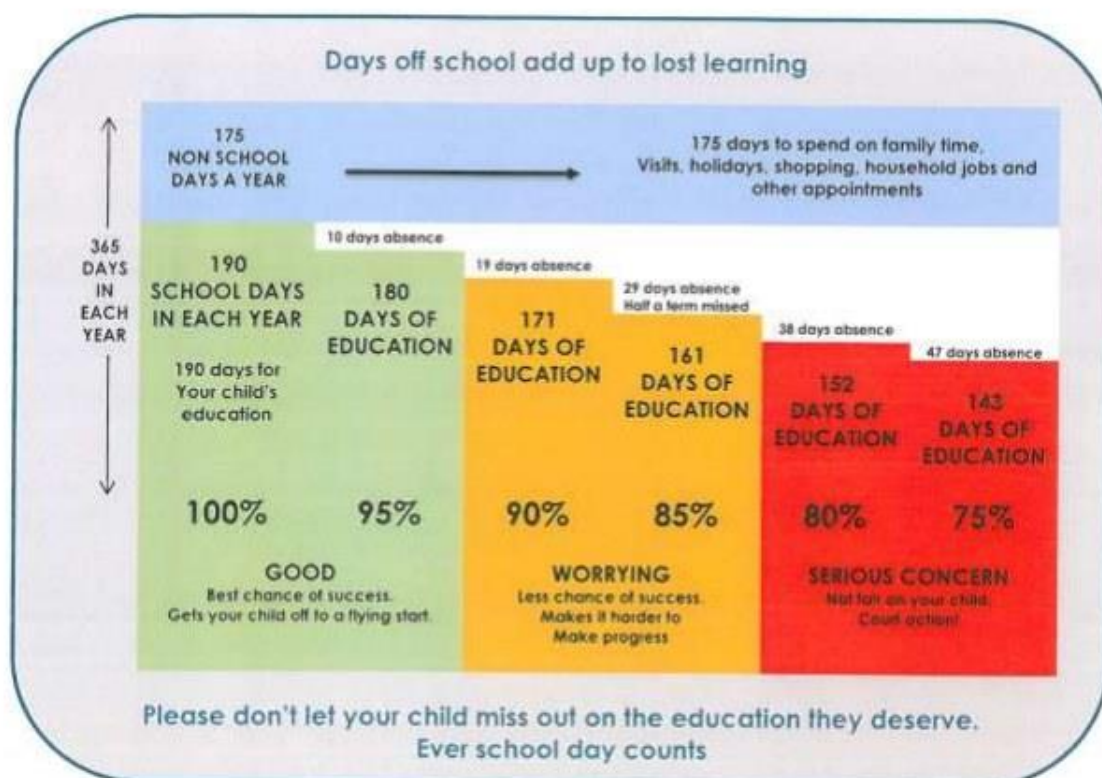
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Achievement Awards
