
## Year 6 Windrush Pop-up Museum

## Chalkwell Character Curriculum: Why do we clean up?



### Why do we clean up?


Today, we'll learn why it is important to keep our school environment clean and tidy.

### How does an untidy space make you feel?

How would an untidy classroom make it harder to learn?

What about if the playground was dirty, how could that affect your play time?

Or if the cutlery and plates in the dining hall weren't clean?



## Why is it important to keep our school clean and tidy?

- It makes our school a welcoming place to be.
- We can get the resources we need for lessons, games and sports easily.
- It reduces waste, helping to save the environment.

## But don't we have cleaners?

Cleaning up shows we respect our surroundings and the people who use them (e.g. our friends, teachers, family members, **and** the cleaning staff).

It teaches us that someone else shouldn't have to clean up our personal messes - we all have a joint responsibility for our shared space.

How can you help?



### Step 1: Put things you have used back where they came from.

It can be really tempting to shove things in your tray, locker or even just leave them laying around.

Tidying up is much easier if you do it as you go - when you have finished using one thing, put it back in the correct spot before taking another.



### Step 2: Pick up items from the floor (even if it isn't yours!)

If you see something on the floor that shouldn't be there, pick it up and return it to the correct place or put it in the bin.

If it is paper, use the recycling bin so we can look after our environment.

Things like glitter, crumbs or small bits of paper can be swept up using a dustpan and brush.



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**Step 3: Wipe muddy shoes on the door mats before you come in.**

We live in a country that can get very wet and muddy - it's inevitable that sometimes our shoes will get messy.

However, we can help keep the stairs and classrooms clean by wiping our feet on the door mats as we come in and not putting football boots on for clubs until absolutely necessary.



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**Step 4: Minimise mess in the first place.**

These are some situations that could be messier than others like eating lunch, painting or working with clay.

The best thing to do in these situations is follow instructions carefully and slowly to stop things from getting out of control. It's a lot easier to clean up a small mess than a big one!



The teacher has asked Ellie and Max to put some equipment away. They're not sure where it goes so they're thinking about leaving it in the middle of the shed.

What could they do instead?



Laura has finished her drink and goes to the sink to put her glass away. It's full and the dishwasher has just finished cleaning some other items. She leaves the glass on the side.

Erin has got a really big cookie for her packed lunch. It's crumbly and has left pieces on the desk and some on the floor. She's not worried because it's not her place. She goes out to lunch.

What could she do instead?



Harry was so excited to get the paint out for his art lesson that he squeezed way too much onto the pallet. He decides to mix it in with another colour.

What could he do instead?

Let's continue to show our support and demonstrate the strength of our community spirit!





*On Wednesday, the children were delighted by a drama production in the dining hall, and on Thursday we relaxed with some festive snacks while watching a Christmas film.*




Maths was filled with fun as they engaged in team challenge games that made learning exciting! 🎲




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























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## Year 6

*A huge thank you to our tour guides, who were absolutely brilliant and shared their knowledge with confidence and enthusiasm.*





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
































## Achievement Awards

**Important facts about school attendance:**

- There are 190 school days each academic year
- There are 175 other days for holidays and other activities
- The national average for school attendance is 95%
- 90% attendance represents 1 day non-attendance a fortnight
- 80% attendance represents 1 day non-attendance a week

At CHJS, we always strive for 100% attendance. We understand that illness occurs from time to time but ask that you support your child's learning and us a school by ensuring your child is in school every day and on time.

Our aim is that every child is in school every session, every day so we can give them the best education we can. Attendance is a key indicator to a child's success so we will be looking to be even better every week! We will be focusing on ensuring attendance is as good as it can be next year.

### What YOU must do:

Try to telephone the school before 8.30am each day of your child's absence.

Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters.

If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival.

Have a backup plan for if your child misses transport, call on a family member, neighbour or friend.

If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance then talk to us as a first step so we can help!

**What WE will do:**

Check your child's attendance every day.

Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.

Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned.

If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a welfare home visit.


