Free school meal (FSM) eligibility

From September 2026, the Department for Education (DfE) will expand free school meal (FSM) eligibility to include all pupils from households receiving Universal Credit. This creates two categories:

- **Targeted FSM:** Based on the existing £7,400 income threshold
 - **Expanded FSM:** Covers meals only for pupils in households receiving Universal Credit who do not qualify for Targeted FSM
-

Free school meals are available to pupils who are, or whose parents are, in receipt of:

- Universal Credit
 - Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
-

A pupil is only eligible if:

- A claim has been made, and
 - Eligibility has been verified by the school or local authority
-

Households may also qualify if they:

- Receive income-related Employment and Support Allowance
 - Receive the guarantee element of Pension Credit
 - Meet criteria set out in separate guidance for **families with no recourse to public funds**

 - *Foster children are not usually eligible, as fostering allowances are intended to cover meal costs*

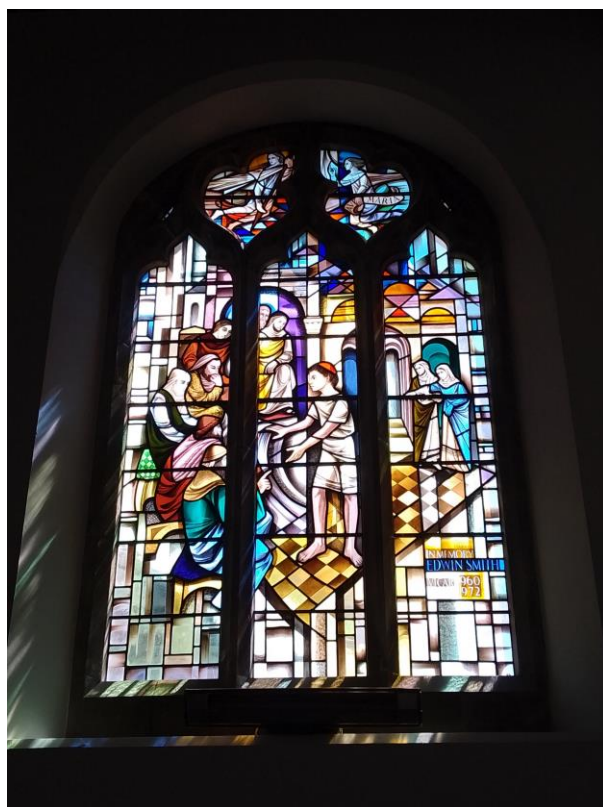

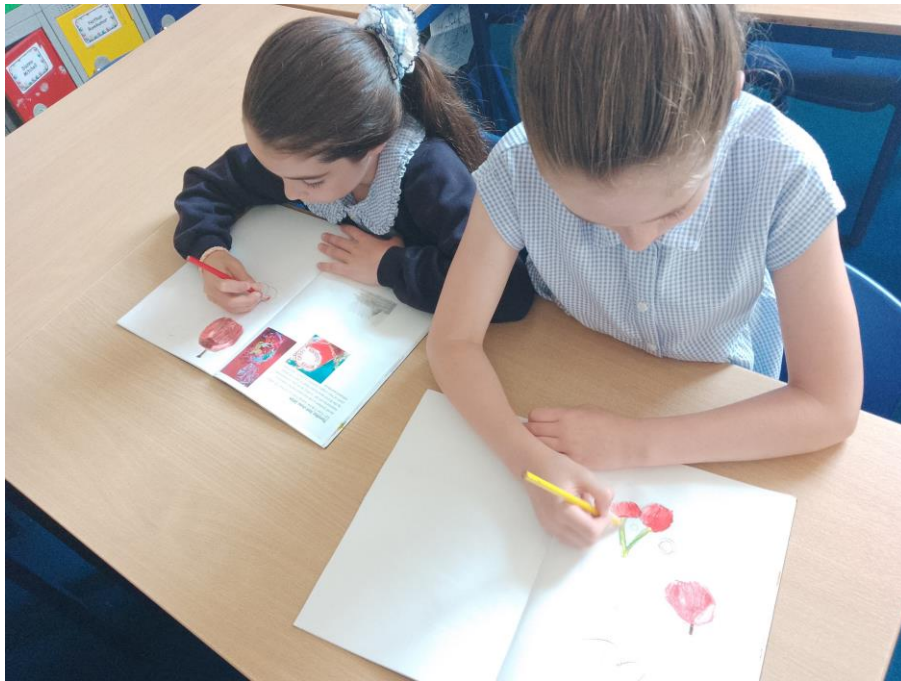
In Art, we have been exploring tone and texture, experimenting with different techniques to create depth and interest in our work.

What a productive week it has been for Year 5!. We'd like to congratulate the children for their fantastic attitude throughout assessment week. They approached each challenge with maturity and

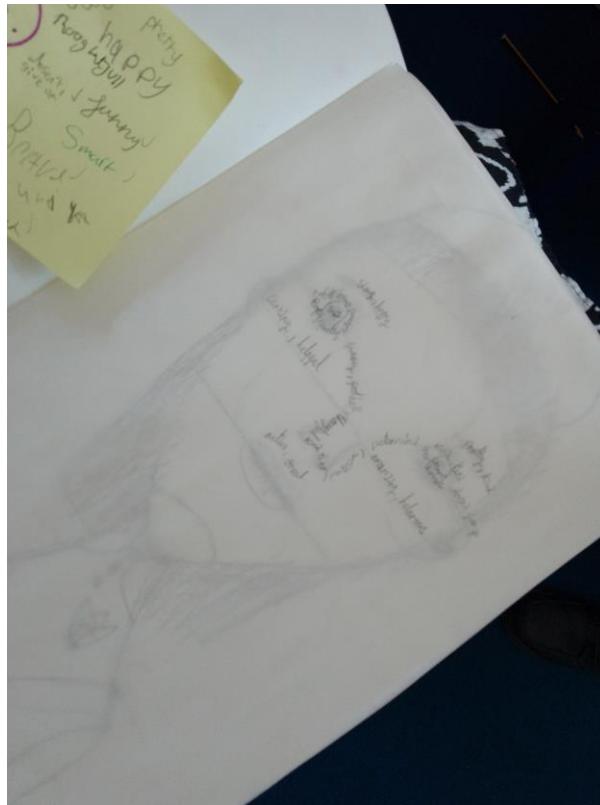
