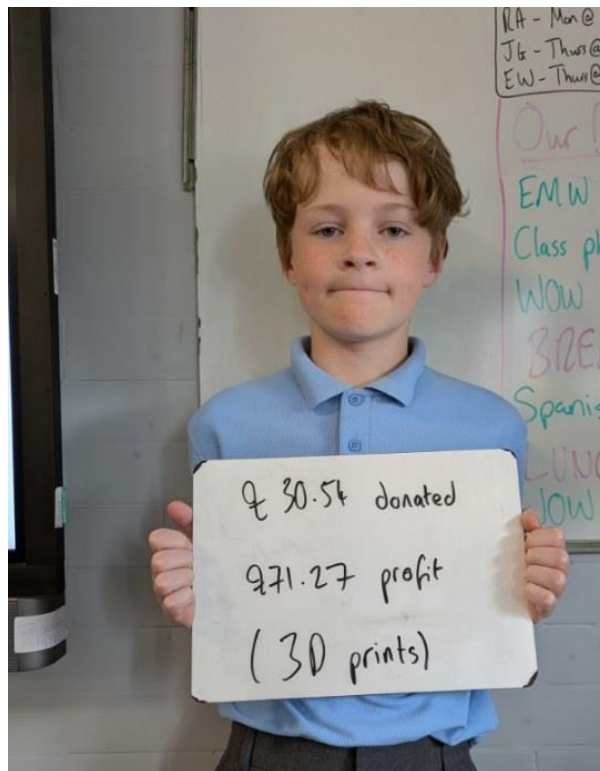
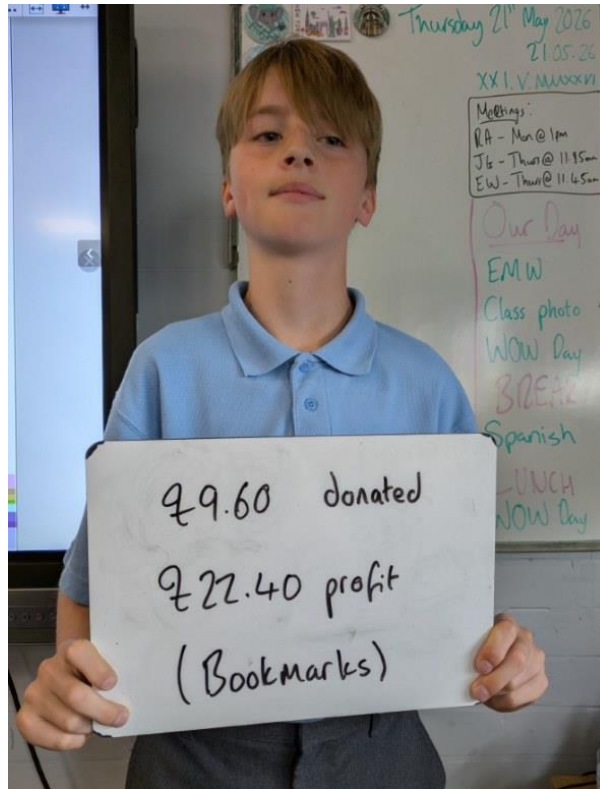
Entrepreneur Club Sale - the future is very bright!

Free school meal (FSM) eligibility

From September 2026, the Department for Education (DfE) will expand free school meal (FSM) eligibility to include all pupils from households receiving Universal Credit. This creates two categories:

- **Targeted FSM:** Based on the existing £7,400 income threshold
 - **Expanded FSM:** Covers meals only for pupils in households receiving Universal Credit who do not qualify for Targeted FSM

Free school meals are available to pupils who are, or whose parents are, in receipt of:

- Universal Credit
 - Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
-

A pupil is only eligible if:

- A claim has been made, and
 - Eligibility has been verified by the school or local authority
-

Households may also qualify if they:

- Receive income-related Employment and Support Allowance
 - Receive the guarantee element of Pension Credit
 - Meet criteria set out in separate guidance for **families with no recourse to public funds**

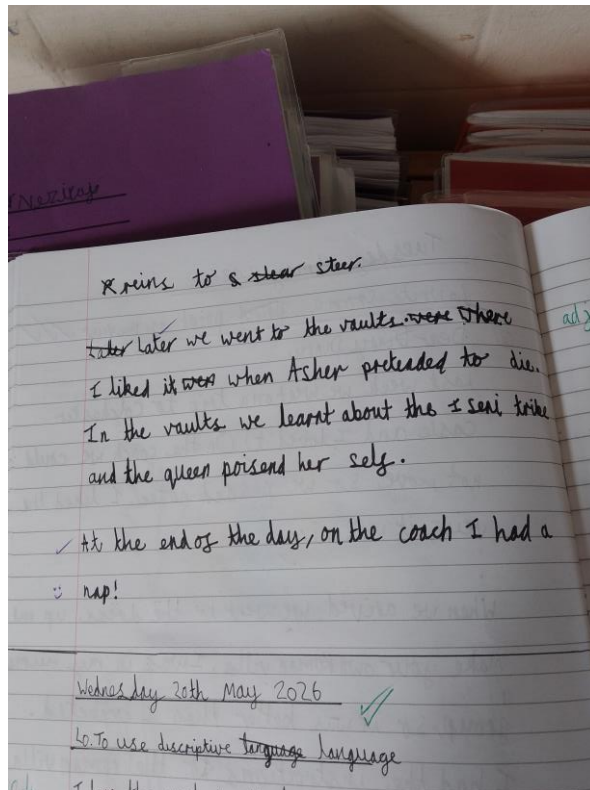

Exploring the question 'Why do animals matter?' in RE has prompted some great discussions and we have enjoyed representing our ideas creatively in Art.

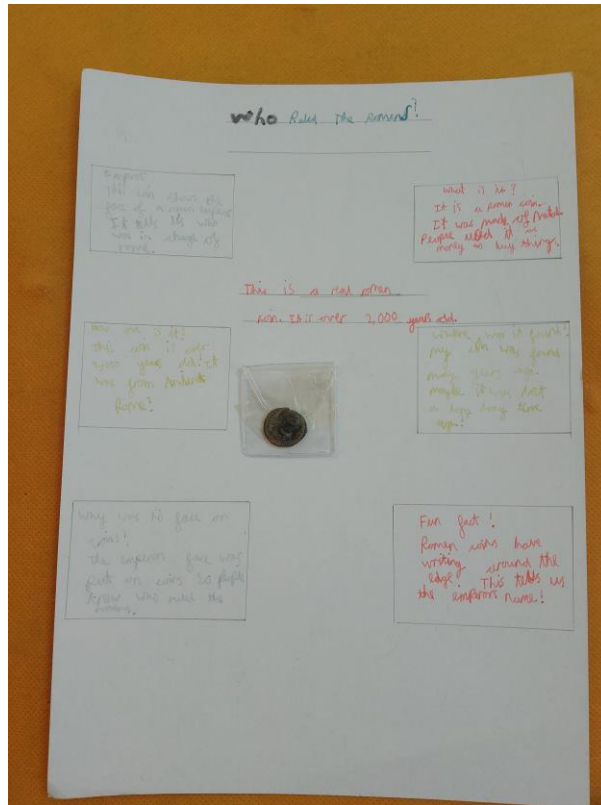

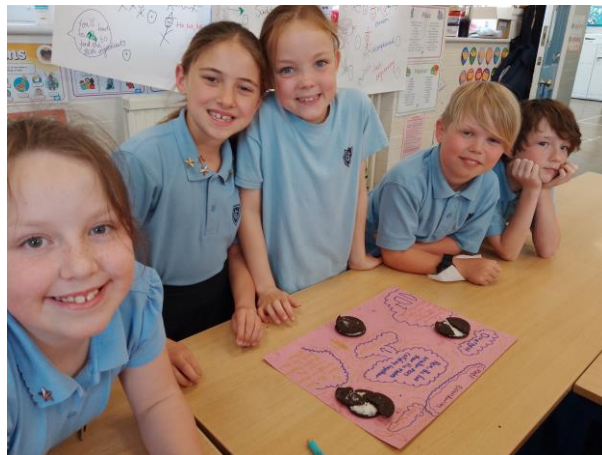
Year 4

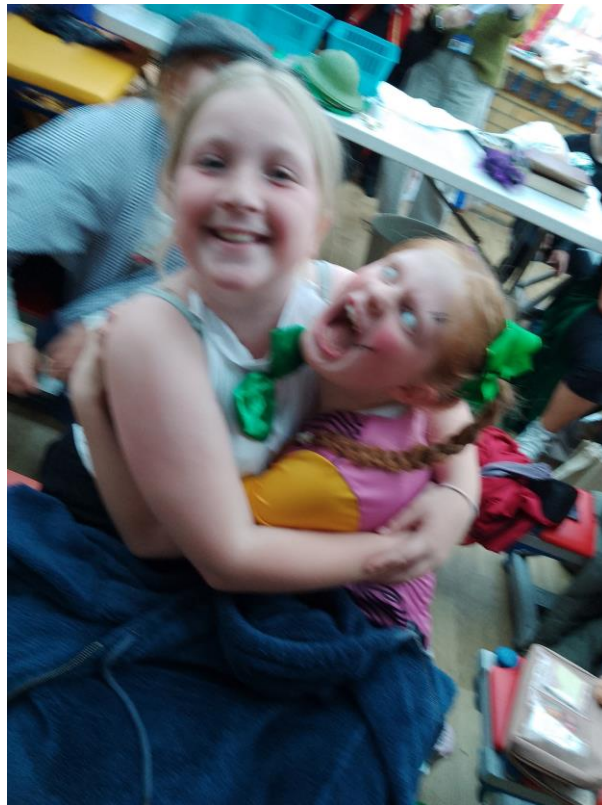

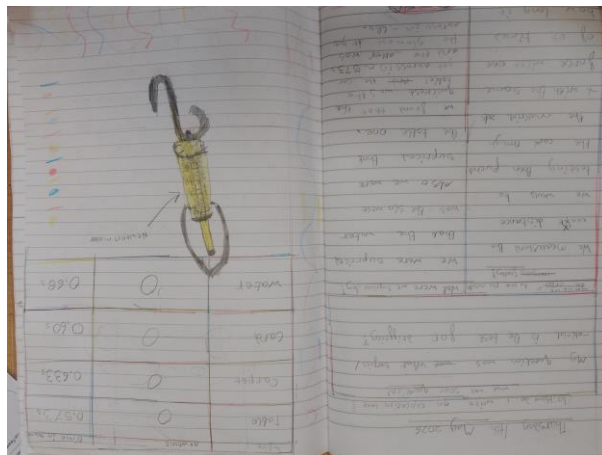
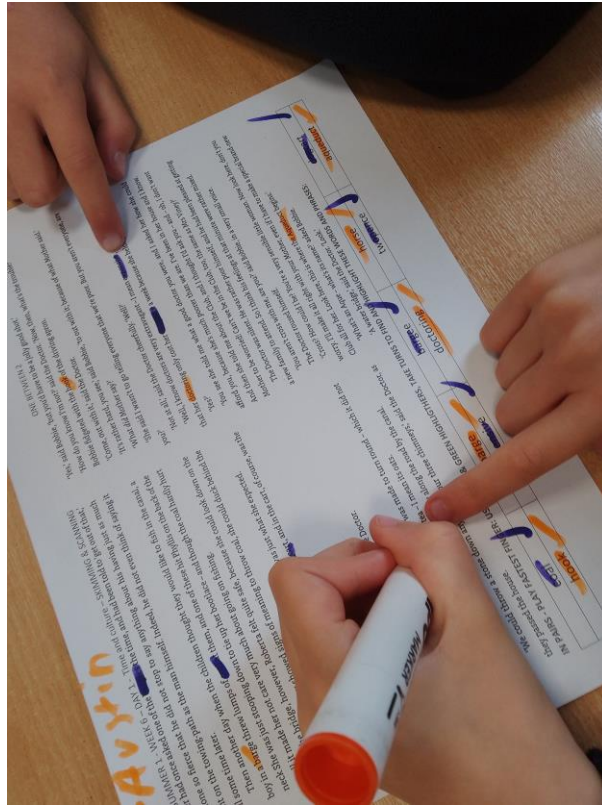

How Does Dragging work in Friction?

on Tuesday 12th of May we had Mrs. Tomlinson and an experiment on dragging and friction.

We tested a toy car on a platform of different surfaces: wood, wool, carpet and sand paper. We did it 3 times on the car and timed it 3 times per surface and found the average. These are how we found out which there were other things we will write other theories on the next 2 weeks.

Materials:

 Wood 0.575
 Sandpaper 0.60
 Wool 0.68

How friction works?

Friction is a force when two objects collide on a surface and slows something down. In our science lesson we used...

What we used:

- Paper
- Carpet
- Cardboard
- Flimsy plastic
- Chalk board
- A ramp

In for matter/what we did:

Firstly we put the ramp on a bit in the finger board. Next we got the materials: paper, carpet, smooth wood, flimsy plastic and a chalk board. We put the materials on the ramp and pushed the board. Then we pushed down the ramp. We tested that the board couldn't roll down the carpet.

Predictions

I predicted that the carpet and the paper would take the longest because the carpet has little bumps and we needed many pieces of paper which may slow it down. I also predicted that the flimsy would have the most friction but I realised that the smooth wood had the least friction. I think that my prediction was really close.

Have you ever wondered why your hands go warm when you rub them together? Have you ever wondered how your brakes work on a bike? This is friction!

What we will improve next time:

Next time we will put the ramp on more of a bit so the board will go down the carpet. We could also use a better board so that we don't have any wobbly tests.

To conclude, the carpet had the most friction so the board couldn't roll down it. To add to that, the smooth wood had the least friction wobbly down.

FRODOUS FRICTION!

Have you ever thought of what surface has the most friction? Well, we've experimented on different surfaces like cardboard, whiteboard and more.

What is friction?
Friction is when something collides and rubs with another thing. For example, a car is on a rubber surface, it will have less friction than sandpaper surface, which has many minerals and gives like carpet. This will slow the car down a lot because the car will get stuck.

Predictions
I thought the book is going to have the least car friction because it has a smooth surface. The it is very smooth, it can slide quickly so that it could speed up. The cardboard was the one with the least amount of friction, and the sandpaper which has many fibers, so slow it down so it was the slowest material for the surface.

CONCLUSION

Although friction can be horrible, it can be a lifesaver. If you're cold in the deep forest, and don't have any heat, you can rub your hands together, creating heat for your hands. If friction didn't exist, you would be dead!

We used sandpaper, rubber, book, cloth, carpet, whiteboard, wood, glass, and cardboard.

Whiteboard has a very smooth surface like a book. Flanery was also smooth but it was smoother than friction.
