Learning highlights this week!

Year 3

Year 3 have had a wonderful week, with many 'firsts'. We started our new maths topic of fractions and began in a very practical way, making fractions out of salt dough. We also had our new set of Maths Angels from Year 5 join us for the start of Wednesday and Thursday's lessons - our children have greatly benefited from this additional support with their Early Morning Work and it has been wonderful to see the confidence and expertise of the Year 5. children.

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Another 'first' was our first session of Handball in P.E. This defensive game allows us to apply our previously learnt passing skills and learn rules for a new game. The children have also enjoyed beginning their athletics sessions, focusing first on develop sprinting techniques and then how to pass a baton.

Learning about the Romans has already proved very popular and we have enjoyed using a story set in Pompeii in English, learning a Roman marching song in music and enhancing our history lessons with a Roman artefact box from Southend Museum.

Year 4 have had a busy week! In English, the children completed a cold write based on the characters and settings in 'The Firework-Maker's Daughter' by Philip Pullman. It is great to see how the children's writing style and content has been developing throughout the year. Well done year 4 on a great week!

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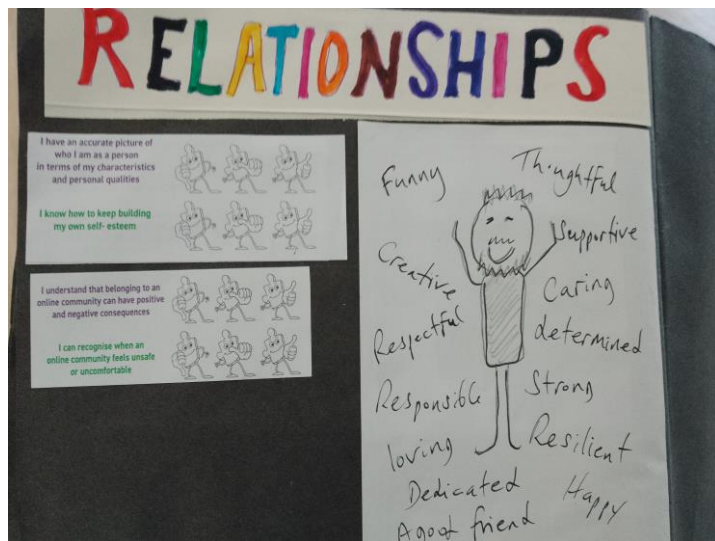
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Year 5

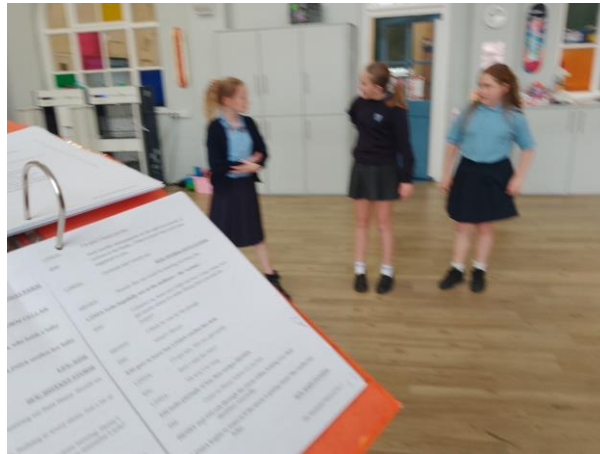
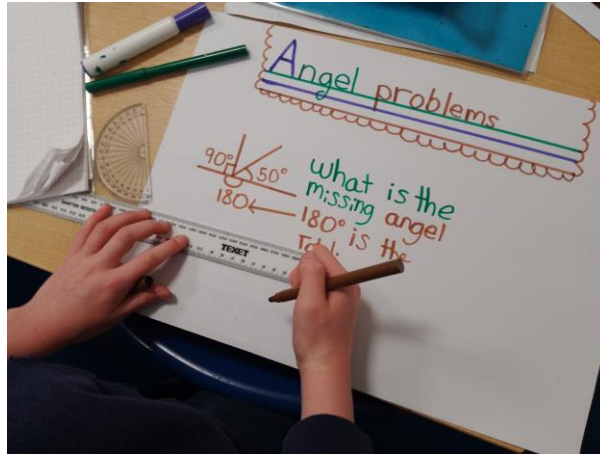

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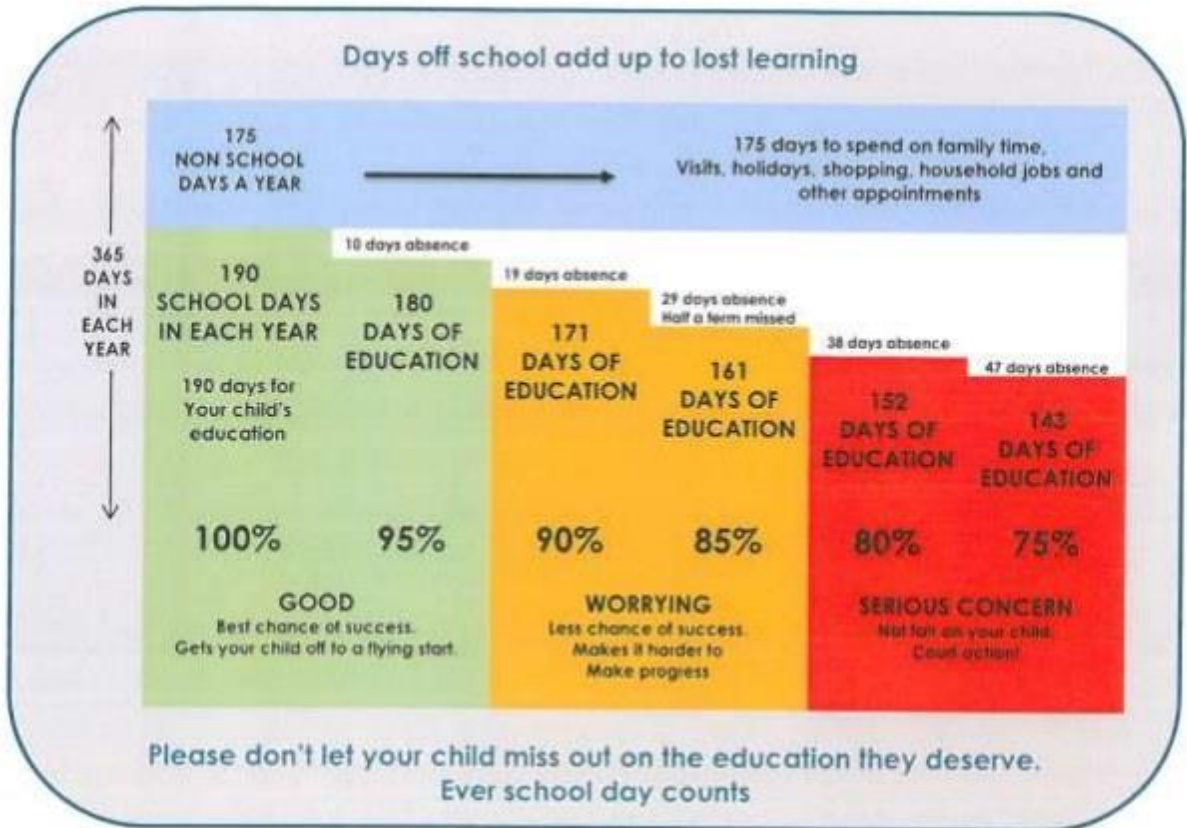
Achievement Awards
