Free school meal (FSM) eligibility

From September 2026, the Department for Education (DfE) will expand free school meal (FSM) eligibility to include all pupils from households receiving Universal Credit. This creates two categories:

- **Targeted FSM:** Based on the existing £7,400 income threshold
 - **Expanded FSM:** Covers meals only for pupils in households receiving Universal Credit who do not qualify for Targeted FSM
-

Free school meals are available to pupils who are, or whose parents are, in receipt of:

- Universal Credit
 - Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
-

A pupil is only eligible if:

- A claim has been made, and
 - Eligibility has been verified by the school or local authority
-

Households may also qualify if they:

- Receive income-related Employment and Support Allowance
 - Receive the guarantee element of Pension Credit
 - Meet criteria set out in separate guidance for **families with no recourse to public funds**

Please note:

- *Southend-on-Sea City Council cannot backdate claims to cover unpaid or previously paid costs*
- *Foster children are not usually eligible, as fostering allowances are intended to cover meal costs*

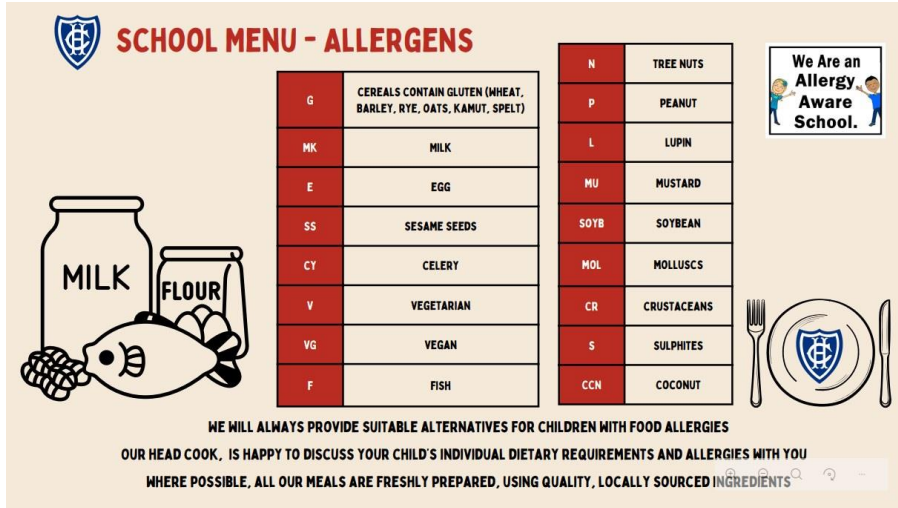

Brownlee Foundation Triathlon Event!

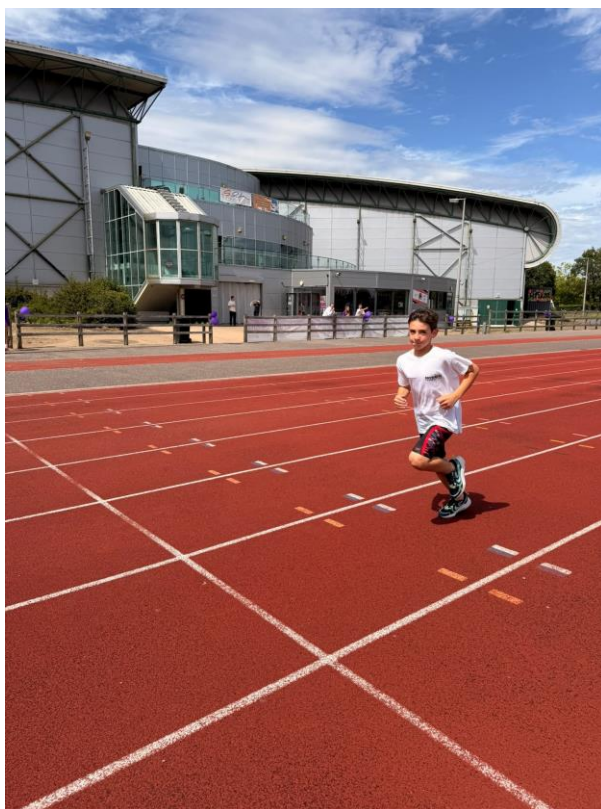

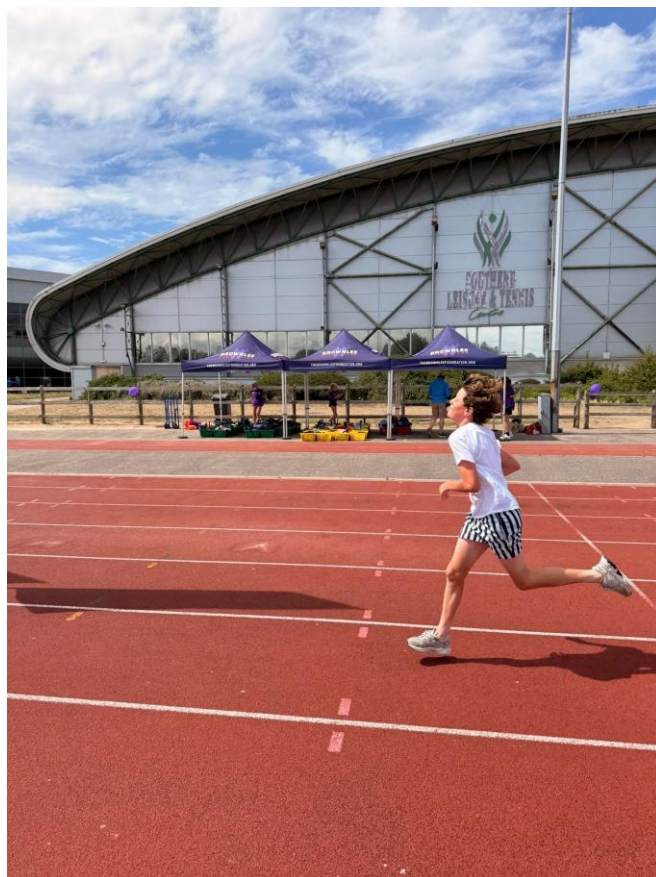

Learning highlights this week!

Year 3

The biggest highlight of our week (apart from meeting our new classes and teachers!) has definitely been starting the actual building of our DT projects. We spent the first few lessons of the half term learning about the features of castles and making 3D shapes from nets to see how they could be incorporated into our designs. After gathering a range of materials, we began the build, focusing on the structures first and then the facades. Lots of fun was had – and also lessons in compromise, co-operation and sharing!

In English this week, we began our last few weeks of descriptive writing. Using clips from the first Harry Potter film, the children wrote about Harry's first trip into Diagon Alley. Use of alliteration, similes, adjective strings and direct speech was recapped and then encouraged in the children's writing.

PSHE over the last few weeks has covered internal and external changes that occur to our bodies as children grow into adults. The lessons have been a pleasure to teach, with the children demonstrating wonderful enquiry skills and maturity.

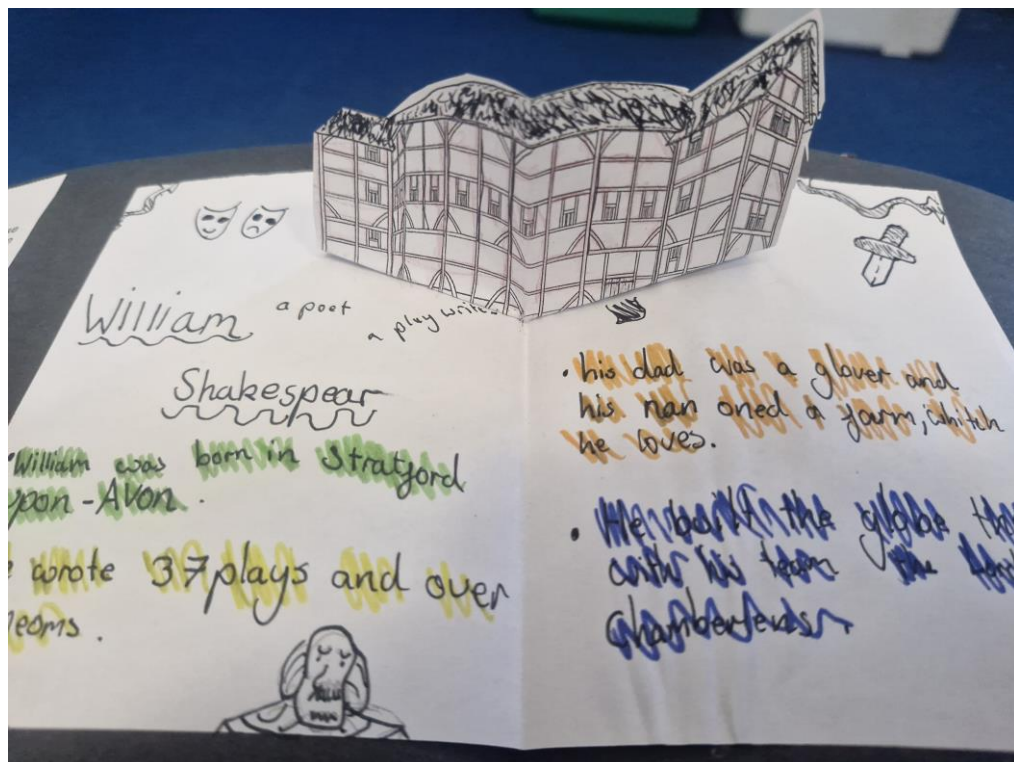
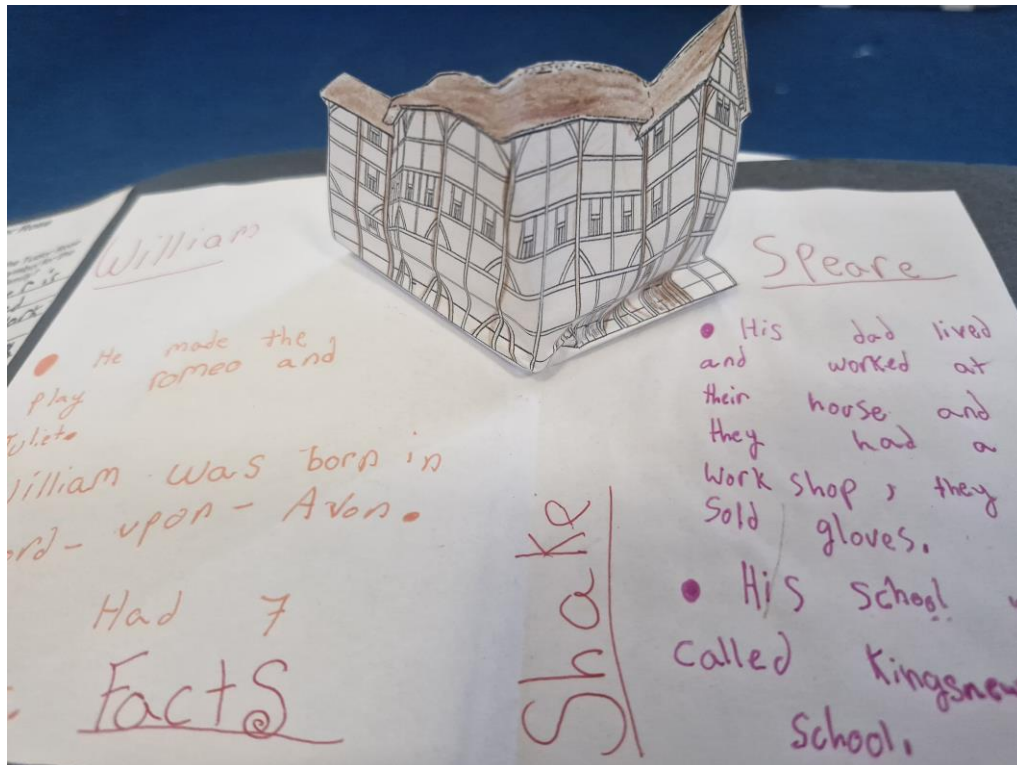

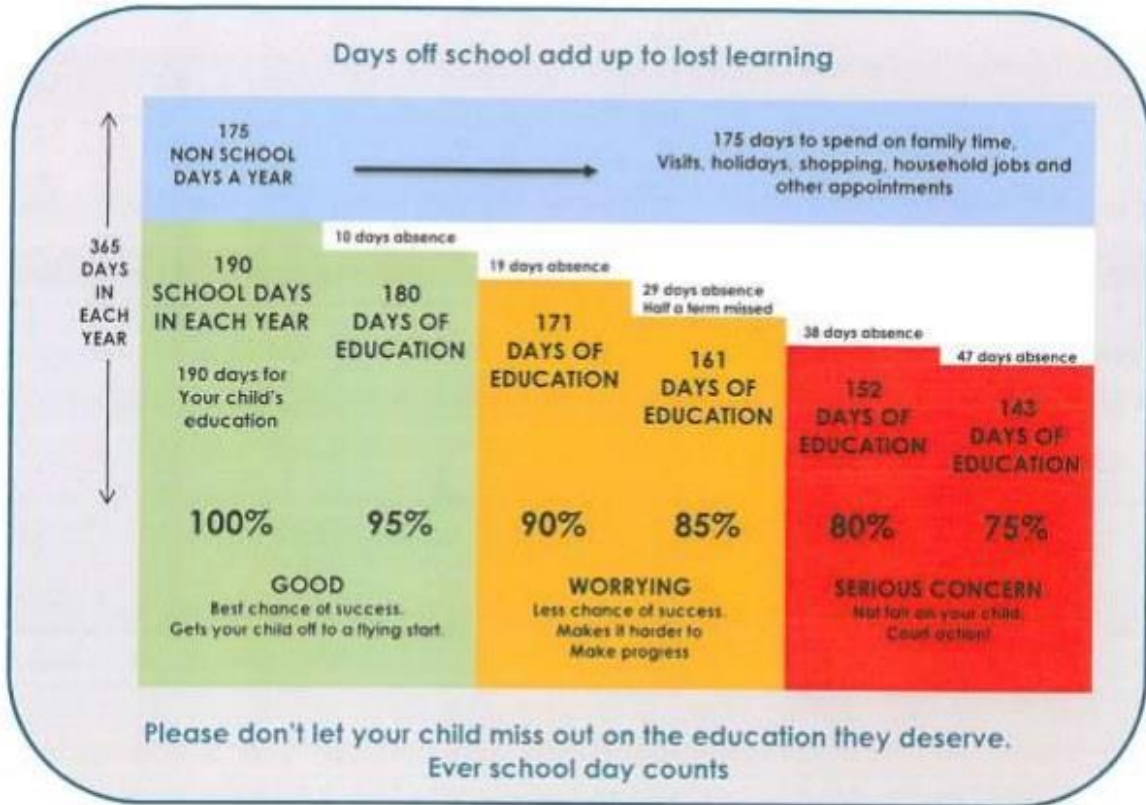
