Walking By Faith

A man named Octavius
Winslow once said, "If we
were only to advance as we
saw the spot on which we
were to place our foot, or
only to go out as we knew
the place whither we were
going, it then were no longer
a life of faith that we lived,
but of sight."

As a human being, I'm much more comfortable living by sight. I like knowing what is coming and how things will play out. I prefer certainty and clarity over ambiguity and unpredictability. You probably do, too.

But that is not how life often works. And it's not how we were made to live! One of the defining characteristics of the Christian life is that "we live by faith, not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7). That's not the exception; it's the rule. As uncomfortable as it may be, it's the kind of life to which God has called each of us. Which means that if we only ever advance or take a step toward something when we can see the place to set our foot, we're actively resisting (or resenting!) the kind of life God has called us to live.



For the past two years, The Orchard North Shore has been walking by faith. Not because we want to but because we've had to. God closed the door on our season of ministry at Christian Heritage Academy almost exactly two years ago, has ushered us into a fresh season of ministry at the Glenview Park Center, and has not yet opened a door for us to settle into a long-term home. We don't know the place where we're going or all the things that God is doing, but He has been with us, sustained us, and blessed us as we've sought to follow Him.

We're unsure what the future holds, but do you know what that's done in us? It has certainly strengthened our faith. It has made us more mature. But it has also kindled our prayers. What else is there to do when we can't see the way ahead except come for help to the One Who has already ordained the way ahead? We've been praying for our present and future ministry as individuals and together as a congregation. On June 1, all six congregations of The Orchard came together to pray for our search for a long-term home as well as for the gospel's advance across the North Shore. We know that God hears prayer and that God uses prayer to make things happen. But God also leverages prayer to change the hearts of His people: to root out of us self-reliance and pride and to build within us dependence and humility. As much as we want a place of our own, what God is teaching us is that prayer is less about what we get and more about the kinds of people God is making us into.

Therefore, we look to Him for all the things we need as we walk this road by faith. "And those who know your name put their trust in you, for you, O Lord, have not forsaken those who seek you." PSALM 9:10
