Sermon Outline

God is:

- The Lord of Creation (vv. 1-7)
- The Shepherd of His people (vv. 8-16)
- The Raiser of the dead (vv. 17-24)

Sermon Questions

- 1. As Pastor Tom shared, Ahab's worship of Baal (1 Kings 16:29-34) provides a major backdrop to the events of 1 Kings 17. If you were studying the Bible on your own without the help of a sermon or a LIFE Group what resources might you use to learn these kinds of helpful background facts? Share resources that have helped you in order to help others!
- 2. Thinking about God being the Lord of Creation (vv. 1-7)...
 - a. Why is this truth important for the Israelites living under Baal-worshiping King Ahab?
 - b. Why are you, personally, grateful for this truth?
- 3. Read Psalm 19:1-6.
 - a. How can God's creation help us worship God?
 - b. Have you ever experienced what Psalm 19 is teaching?
- 4. The shepherding care of God for *Elijah*, *the widow*, *and her son* in vv. 8-16 is a remarkable interlude in a book primarily devoted to discussing *kings*. Share 3 or 4 ways that this interlude impacts you.
- 5. In what ways has God promised to be a *Shepherd* to you and me? (Pastor Tom mentioned Psalm 23 and John 10 in his sermon. Those passages can get you started, but you may have others that come to mind!)
- 6. Have you ever been able to relate to the widow's anguish in vv. 17-18?
- 7. Is there anything we can learn from how Elijah responds to the widow's anguish in vv. 19-21?
- 8. Read 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18.
 - a. While we are not promised an *earthly resurrection* like the widow's son received what are believers promised?
 - b. 1 Thessalonians 4:18 explains that this truth is meant to be *encouraging*. Why is it encouraging to you?
- 9. Overall, how does 1 Kings 17 help cultivate *hope* in your life?
- 10. Any other takeaways from this passage or message?
