Sermon Questions

- 1. John the Baptist had *huge crowds* coming to hear him preach (v. 5).
 - a. When are big numbers a bad reason to pay attention to someone?
 - b. When are they a *good reason* to pay attention to someone?
- 2. Is there someone in your life a grandparent, mentor, coach, etc. whose *fruitfulness* you really admire? What have you learned from them?
- 3. Matthew 3 is the third passage we've studied (along with Luke 1 and John 3) where it's been incredibly clear that John's focus is on *King Jesus*.
 - a. Why is this repetition a reason to tune in rather than tune out?
 - b. Do you ever get tired of repetition in your spiritual life?
 - c. Why is repetition *good for our souls?* (See Philippians 3:1.)
- 4. What is the meaning of the word *repentance?*
 - a. How does today's passage help *define* it? (Try to highlight at least 3-4 ways.)
 - b. If we're all sinners and if none of us will be perfect this side of heaven how can we tell if we *are or are not* repentant?
- 5. Have you been baptized?
 - a. If you have, what do you remember about that day? How did it bless you?
 - b. If you haven't, what's holding you back?
- 6. How does John the Baptist talk about hell in this passage? And why is it important to wrestle with his teaching, regardless of how uncomfortable it may feel to us?
- 7. Any other takeaways from this passage or message?
