Discussion Questions for "Spirit & Power: John's Death"

Mark 6:14-29 (Reading: 6:14-20), Pastor Tom Olson, Weekend of December 13th & 14th, 2025

Sermon Outline

Herodias:

- God's Law applies to every human (v. 18).
- It's possible to begrudge the person showing you your sin (vv. 17-19).

Herod:

- The foolishness of an unwise promise (vv. 21-29).
- The problem of peer pressure even for kings (v. 26).
- The effect that holiness & righteousness can have on a sinful man (v. 20).

John:

- The courage it takes to minister in spirit & power (v. 18).
- The cost of ministering in spirit & power (vv. 14-29).

Jesus:

• It's possible to be both close to & far from the truth (vv. 14-16).

Sermon Questions

- 1. Why are we tempted to begrudge the brother or sister in Christ who shows us our sins? Why shouldn't we?
- 2. When we're the ones who need to point out a fellow believer's sin, what can we do to help them receive what we're saying? Why might they be frustrated anyway?
- 3. Have you ever made an unwise promise?
 - a. What was the situation?
 - b. What did you learn from this?
- 4. We often think about peer pressure affecting teenagers...
 - a. But how do adults experience this, as well? Give some specific examples.
 - b. Is there a place where you're feeling this right now?
- 5. Why did John's holiness & righteousness make such an impact on Herod? Try to think through the inner workings of this. Have you seen the same kind of thing in your own life?

- 6. Why is *worth* it to follow Jesus, despite the *courage* it takes and the *cost* that's often associated with doing so?
- 7. What do we learn about Jesus in this passage?
- 8. Any other takeaways from this passage or message?
