Discussion Questions for "Spirit & Power: John's Question"

Luke 7:18-30, Pastor Tom Olson, Weekend of December 20th & 21st, 2025

Sermon Outline

John's question speaks:

- To your questions (vv. 18-20).
- To the identity of Jesus (vv. 20-22).
- To the mercy of Jesus (vv. 21-23).
- To your identity in Jesus (vv. 24-30).

Sermon Questions

- 1. Why is it important to you, personally, to see that even a man (and a prophet!) as great as John the Baptist still had some questions?
- 2. What catches your attention about the *content* of Jesus' response to John?
 - a. Why is it a big deal that Jesus answers with both words and actions?
 - b. Can you think of other ways in other Scriptures that Jesus demonstrates and proves His identity?
- 3. What catches your attention about the *tone* of Jesus' response to John?
 - a. Do you tend to assume Jesus will be merciful to you when you struggle? Why or why not?
 - b. Similar to a previous question, can you think of other Scriptures in which Jesus proves that He's consistently merciful to sinners and strugglers?
 - c. When our friends and family ask us spiritual questions, what steps can we take to respond to them with the same kind of mercy that Jesus showed John?
- 4. What does Jesus say about John and about us in verse 28?
 - a. Why can Jesus say such thing?
 - b. Read Ephesians 1:3-14. What else does this passage tell us about our identity in Christ?
 - c. What holds you back from embracing what Scripture says about who you are because of Jesus?
 - d. What practical impact does it make to our regular, everyday lives to really know and believe what the Bible says about our identity in Christ?
- 5. Any other takeaways from this passage or message?
