Read: Genesis 32:31, 33:1-3



Outline:

Jacob's bitter departure: (Gen 27:34-41)

- an exceedingly great and bitter cry
- "is he not rightly named Jacob?"
- lifted up his voice and wept
- Esau hated Jacob... "I will kill my brother Jacob"

Jacob's hopes for deliverance:

- His wealth (32:3-5)
- His divisive plan (32:7-8)
- His "deal" with God (32:9-12)
- His tenfold compensation (32:13-15)
- His manipulation (32:16-20)
- His desperate escape attempt (32:22)
- His insincere display of submission (33:3b)

God answers Jacob's fearful prayer (33:4)

- But Esau ran to meet him
- and embraced him
- and fell on his neck and kissed him
- and they wept

"While he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion, and <u>ran</u> and <u>embraced</u> him and <u>kissed</u> him." - **Luke 15:20**
