Discussion Questions

- 1. What did you learn today from the <u>Scripture passage(s)</u> that you didn't know before? What is something that hit you in a fresh way?
- 2. How does James 1:14-15 help us to see why living as you wish, or doing what is right in your own eyes, is a warning to heed?
 - a.) What encouragement do we get from the Holy Spirit in helping us with not living as we wish?
- 3. In verses 5-9, we read about the sin that Herod had to avoid. How does Herod show his fear of man?
- a) What are some ways in which you, and I, struggle with the fear of man?
- b) In pursuing the fear of the Lord, what are practical ways that we can fear God instead of fearing man?
- 4. John the Baptist was imprisoned because he feared God, and told the truth to Herod, despite the persecution that came with it- imprisonment. How is John the Baptist a good example, for us, to follow here? a.) How does James 5:19-20 challenge us with both our Church family, and our family members, or friends, who are unbelievers?
- 5. By now we would have seen the obvious comparisons between Herod and John the Baptist. John feared God and Herod feared man. How does Matthew 10:28 help us to see why John the Baptist was willing to call out Herod in his sin, and face tough consequences?
- 6. In a world that is filled with pain and depravity, how does knowing that Jesus is the resurrection and the life, comfort us as we navigate living in a fallen world?
