Additional information for Sport Premium funding:

In 2022/2023 we will receive sports funding in addition to our healthy budget for ensuring we deliver outstanding PE provision.

Staffing

Bourton Meadow Academy has used this to help fund two full time positions for sports coaches, that have improved the quality of curriculum lessons, competitive events, lunchtime clubs and after school clubs. Staff are more qualified to provide outstanding PE and resources enable us to deliver an outstanding PE curriculum. This increased team has enabled us to facilitate and coach more sports teams for sports events and competitions.

Quality of Lessons

Bourton Meadow Academy sports provision has the aim of providing engaging sports sessions with quality coaching. Funding has allowed for many lessons to have a specialist member of staff teaching providing a ratio of 1:30 in sessions where possible. This has impacted positivity on pupils as we are able to engage more with pupils on a large group/small group/one to one basis, providing valuable structure and feedback.

Celebration of Sport

Our funding has provided more opportunities for pupils to be involved in School Games Day. We have improved the range of events and used our new staff to prepare pupils during lessons and in extracurricular clubs. In addition, we hold Sporting Open Days to show a range of dances that have been learnt by the pupils during curriculum lessons.

Evidencing the impact of the PE and Sport Premium – Bourton Meadow Academy

Swimming

We are providing swimming provision for our Year 3, Year 4 and Year 5 pupils to enable them to receive high quality coaching from professional teachers. Funding has paid for swimming training so that our quality of swimming lessons is maintained with both external swimming teachers and Bourton Meadow Academy Staff. We have increased the amount of swimming provision available to pupils with 3 full terms running from the start of the autumn term till the end of the summer term 2023.

Equipment and Resources

We have invested in premium sport equipment to help facilitate new activities and improve the quality of existing sports/activities within our curriculum remit. For example, children now have access to a variety of activities and access to more niche sports. For example, we have introduced Maypole dancing into the curriculum and increased participation in dance competitions.

Participation of Extracurricular clubs

Our PE coaches have enabled Bourton Meadow to increase the amount of after-school clubs to increase the opportunities of all ability children.

Squads, Lunchtime/Change 4 Life Clubs

Our funding has enabled the academy to provide squad training free of charge for gifted and talented pupils to experience sport in a competitive environment. Change4Life and Lunchtime clubs are available to target pupils to enable them to gain more confidence and provide a positive experience in sport.
