We are grateful to report that God has blessed us abundantly during this missions season. September and October are typically the busiest months for missionaries, as most churches hold their annual Missions Conferences during this time. These conferences provide valuable opportunities to connect with congregations interested in partnering with missionaries through prayer and financial support. Over the past two months, we have been privileged to minister in eleven meetings, six of which were missions conferences. We praise God that our support level has now reached 94%.

Each meeting has been a blessing, but one experience stands out in particular. At one conference, the church organized a "Missions Olympics" for the children, dividing them into age groups and allowing each group to select missionaries to sponsor. Through friendly competition and games, the winning group earned the privilege of presenting their sponsored missionaries with the funds they had raised themselves. This creative approach engaging children in missions work was a first for our family, and it created wonderful memories—especially for our children, who also had the opportunity to participate.

As we approach the conclusion of our deputation journey, we have eight meetings remaining for the year. One of our boys remarked, "That doesn't sound so bad." Emily and I couldn't help but smile. The finish line is indeed in sight, and our entire family is eager for the next phase of ministry. To prepare for our transition, we will begin online language training in early December with an instructor from the school we'll attend in Romania. Please pray that we can establish a strong foundation in the basics, which will serve us well once we arrive in Romania.

During a recent missions conference, our family joined the church in door-to-door soul winning. It was encouraging to see our children's boldness as they knocked on doors and invited people to church. At one home, a man identified himself as Catholic, and when I asked him about his salvation, he responded, "I have a lot of work to do." Before I could reply, he turned and closed the door. My heart was burdened for him. I pray he will read the tract we left and come to understand that he doesn't have to do any good works—Jesus Christ has already completed the work at Calvary. Though I don't know his name, would you please join me in praying that he will open his eyes to the truth of the Gospel?

As I close this letter, I want to express my profound gratitude for the privilege of serving our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. It is a privilege I do not deserve. If you've ever questioned whether it's worth it, I can say with certainty: He is worth it all.
