DESIGNATION OF EMPLOYEES NECESSARY TO CONDUCT MINIMUM BASIC OPERATIONS

Executive Order 2020-21, issued by Michigan Governor Gretchen Whitmer on March 23, 2020 ("EO 21") authorizes a business to designate those workers necessary to conduct "minimum business operations." Section 4(b) of EO 21 describes those workers as those "whose in-person presence is strictly necessary to allow the business or operation to maintain the value of inventory and equipment, care for animals, ensure security, process transactions (including payroll and employee benefits), or facilitate the ability of others to work remotely."

SAFETY AND HYGIENE REQUIREMENTS

Section 3 of EO 21 requires that "all individuals who leave their home or place of residence must adhere to social distancing measures recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, including remaining at least six feet from people from outside the individual's household to the extent feasible under the circumstances."

Section 5(c) of EO 21 imposes the following obligations:

- c. Businesses and operations maintaining in-person activities must adopt social distancing practices and other mitigation measures to protect workers and patrons. Those practices and measures include, but are not limited to:
 - 1. Restricting the number of workers present on premises to no more than is strictly necessary to perform the business's or operation's critical infrastructure functions.
 - 2. Promoting remote work to the fullest extent possible.
 - 3. Keeping workers and patrons who are on premises at least six feet from one another to the maximum extent possible, including for customers who are standing in line.
 - 4. Increasing standards of facility cleaning and disinfection to limit worker and patron exposure to COVID-19, as well as adopting protocols to clean and disinfect in the event of a positive COVID-19 case in the workplace.
 - 5. Adopting policies to prevent workers from entering the premises if they display respiratory symptoms or have had contact with a person who is known or suspected to have COVID-19.
 - 6. Any other social distancing practices and mitigation measures recommended by the Centers for Disease Control.

We anticipate that there will be an extremely limited number of team members in an AEH office at any given time. Those in the office should make every effort to avoid using shared space or equipment. For example, if you use a printer, wash your hands thoroughly before and after using the printer.

ALLEN EDWIN HOME BUILDERS, LLC has taken the position that a worker will be designated as necessary to conduct "minimum basic operations" only with that worker's written consent and agreement to comply with the safety and hygiene requirements identified above, as well as additional requirements which may be imposed. Agreeing to be designated as a worker necessary to conduct "minimum basic operations" is not a condition of continued employment.
