New Year, Same Gospel

It's that time of year again. The calendar flips, the gym ads get loud, and the pressure quietly creeps in: *Time to be better.*

I'll be honest with you, I kind of stink at New Year's resolutions. I've made them. I've meant them. And to be honest usually I do even start them, they just make me feel good in the moments leading up to a New Year, "this years going to be different"

And if I'm honest about the heart behind most resolutions, it usually comes down to one thing: being better.

Maybe you've asked the same question I have: *Am I better than last year?* Maybe... one percent? On a good day?

Our culture is so soaked in "new year, new you" that it's easy, very easy, for Christians to assume that's basically the message of faith too. If we're not careful, the sermon becomes: *Try harder. Do more. Fix yourself. Improve. Be better.* And I'll admit, even pastors can unintentionally echo that message, because we breathe the same cultural air.

But here's the problem: "Be better" isn't the Gospel.

The Gospel is not self-improvement. It's not spiritual hustle. It's not a divine performance review where God looks us over at the end of January to see if we're trending upward.

The Gospel is grace.

"While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." And last time I checked... yep. Still a sinner. Still human. Still a work in progress. Still in need of mercy.

So what if we looked at the New Year through a different lens—not a guilt-filled lens, not a "prove you're worthy" lens—but a grace-filled lens?

Maybe the invitation of the New Year isn't to *fix yourself*, but to receive again the One who already came to save you.

Maybe the faithful question isn't "How will I become better?" but "How will I live as someone already loved?"



Maybe the goal isn't to white-knuckle our way to transformation, but to stay close to Christ—the One who actually changes hearts, heals what's broken, forgives what's real, and gives strength for what's next.

Maybe, in a world addicted to improvement, the most countercultural Christian practice is simply to be.

Be where you are.

Be present.

Be honest.

Be open to God.

Be willing to begin again—not with shame, but with hope.

I haven't read it yet, but it's on my New Year reading list: *Stop Fixing Yourself* by Anthony de Mello. The title alone feels like a word many of us need. Because the Good News isn't that we finally get ourselves together. The Good News is that Christ has already come for us, right in the middle of our mess and He isn't letting go.

So as this New Year begins, maybe your “resolution” can be gentler, and truer:

Not because you will be perfect this year, but because Christ is faithful, so maybe I will just start each morning with a hymn “Morning by Morning new mercies I see”

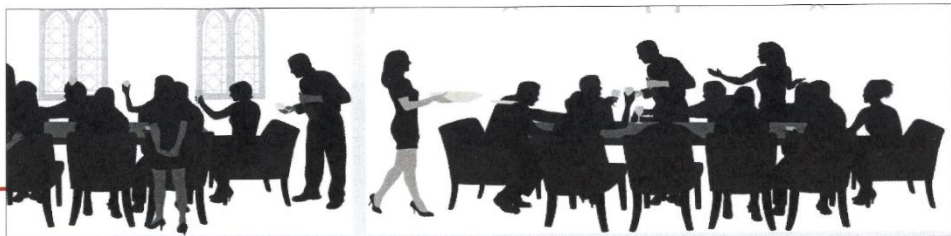
