Message to Catholic Schools for Education Sunday



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This year, the Catholic Church in England and Wales will observe Education Sunday on 13th September, the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel reading this year for the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time, is taken from St Matthew's Gospel: "At that time: Peter came up and said to Jesus, 'Lord, how often will my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?' Jesus said to him, 'I do not say to you seven times, but seventy times seven. (Matt 18:21-35)" As the new academic year begins in our Catholic schools, colleges and universities, and rejoicing in the overflowing forgiveness of Our Heavenly Father which is revealed to us in the person of His Son Jesus Christ, we place before Almighty God in prayer all the pupils and students, staff members and leaders, governors and directors of our educational institutions. During this special Jubilee Year of St Francis of Assisi, proclaimed by Pope Leo XIV on the occasion of the 800th anniversary of the Saint's death, we also pray that we will be inspired to imitate the Poor Man of Assisi to work for peace, live simply, be of service to the poor, and trustworthy stewards of God's creation. On Education Sunday, we give thanks to the Lord for the vocations of all who work within the Catholic sector: the teaching and support staff, chaplains, school leaders and governors. It is through their commitment and hard work that pupils and students in our schools, colleges and universities can thrive and contribute to society, through their formation and education. In the academic year ahead, let us endeavour to give witness to the message of forgiveness, reconciliation and peace in the Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ, and to pray that our Catholic schools, colleges and universities will be beacons of His good news in our communities.

God's Love for You

The Holy Family's Obedience & Faith (3)

In the Mass Eucharistic Prayer I,
the Priest sometimes prays the followings:
"...In communion with those whose
memory we venerate, especially the
glorious ever-Virgin Mary, Mother of our
God...". Truly, this is what the Church
believes. In God's Almighty and Goodness,
He made Mary become the Mother of God
yet preserved her virginity. Our Lord once
told St Bridget of Sweden: "...by entering
the womb of the Virgin like the sun shining
through the clearest gem. For just as the sun
does not damage the glass by entering it,
likewise the virginity of the Virgin was not
lost when I assumed Manhood." So, in this
conception, and in this child-birth, there
was nothing impure, nothing sinful, nothing
that had to be purged, for this offspring is
the fount of purity, and is come to make a
cleansing of sins. Why then the Holy
Family went for the Purification?
Since Jesus and Mary would not have been
subject to the law of Moses being without
sin! But to teach us obedience, they submit
to this law fully. Indeed, the knot of Eve's
disobedience was untied by Mary's
obedience. You might ask then, did Mary
ever feel wronged? Because by attending
the purification, she will no longer be being
regarded as a virgin in other people's eyes,
at least at her lifetime? Yes, Mary kept
silent, even it means it sacrificed her
reputation. Mary kept God's Mystery as a
hidden mystery from others eyes, as God
did not ask her to announce the Incarnation
to her people, but she trusted that God will
reveal it all at His appointed time.
Mary waited in faith.
