The life of the Saints, that is, of great lovers, is interwoven with acts of adoration and contemplation which maintain them continually above all other created things. At the same time, all the powers of nature weigh these lovers down and tend to draw them away from the sublime height. They are like people torn apart by two powers, as opposite as pleasure and pain, and stronger than themselves: on the one hand, the power of supreme love which lifts them up and, on the other, the power of all those attractions, suffering and even necessities of nature which throws them down to earth.

Love for the Lord, then, is one with love for the poor. The same Jesus who tells us. "The poor you will always have with you" (Mt 26:11) also promises the disciples, "I am with you always" (Mt 28:20). We likewise think of his saying: "Just as you did it to the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me" (Mt 25:40).

This is not a matter of mere human kindness but a revelation: contact with those who are lowly and powerless is a fundamental way of encountering the Lord of history.
