An Idea Born in a Tavern

ne of the toughest challenges for our various ministries is managing conflicting schedules.

Young professionals have limited free time, and early on, we learned that dedicating a Friday night to "church adjacent activities" was not appealing to everyone in our original group. Times change, and as our ministry has grown over the last year, so has our thinking! The innovative idea for a Hot Sauce Swap and tasting event was born from a casual conversation (a big thanks to Albert) at Tavern 18.

Despite my own initial doubts—a moment like Peter losing focus and faith—we pressed on. Relying heavily on years of goodwill and partnership with our Diocesan friends around the city. Understanding that no single date would work well for everyone. The results were truly phenomenal, testament to inter-church collaboration.

We were thrilled to welcome nearly 40 young adults into our undercroft! A significant sign of our successful outreach was that half of those attendees were members of other local Episcopal congregations. We were especially honored to have Deacon Andrew Stump from Christ Church Georgetown join us and offer a blessing over our feast. We are deeply grateful to God for the many fruits of this labor, and thankfully, no one ended up needing the ER!

As we embark on seeking to further grow, our focus remains on seeking opportunities to reach beyond the doors of our Parish and continue building connections across the wider church community.

In Celebration of National Hispanic and Latin Heritage Month A Message from vEnessa Y Acham, Vestry Member

In celebration of National Hispanic and Latin Heritage Month and our commitment to Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Accessibility, we are excited to share with our All Souls Parish the inspiring story of The Right Reverend Bavi Edna "Nedi" Rivera.

Mother Sara met Bishop Nedi Rivera when she was a seminarian at Virginia Theological Seminary and was impressed with her warm humanity that shone out

the love of Jesus Christ.

We rejoice also at All Souls Episcopal Church in Washington DC to celebrate the recently appointed first ever female Archbishop of Canterbury, Sarah Mullally, currently the Bishop of London! God is doing a new thing!



First woman of Latin American descent as ordained priest In 1972, Bavi Edna "Nedi" Rivera learned at a meeting that the Episcopal Church planned to begin ordaining women as priests. Raised in the

Episcopal Church, she felt called to pursue the priesthood. One major obstacle, however, was her father—Bishop Victor Rivera of San Joaquin. Bishop Victor Rivera strongly opposed the ordination of women. Despite his opposition, Nedi Rivera entered the seminary and was ordained a deacon on June 28, 1975.

The Reverend Nedi Rivera earned her Master of Divinity in 1976 from the Church Divinity School of the Pacific in Berkeley, California. On May 5, 1979, she was ordained to the priesthood by Bishop C. Kilmer Myers of California, becoming the first woman of Latin American descent to be ordained in the Episcopal Church. Her father, Bishop Victor Rivera, did not attend the ceremony.

The Reverend Nedi Rivera later served as Rector of Saint George's Episcopal Church in Salinas, in the Diocese of El Camino Real, from 1984 to 1993. From 1994 to 2004, she led Saint Aidan's Episcopal Church in San Francisco as Rector.

Although English was spoken at home during her youth, The Reverend Nedi Rivera

worked diligently to become fluent in Spanish. Now, she regularly preaches and celebrates Holy Eucharist in both languages.

First Hispanic woman as consecrated bishop

In 2004, The Reverend Nedi

Rivera was elected suffragan bishop in the Diocese of Olympia (Western Washington) and was consecrated on January 22, 2005, becoming the first Hispanic woman to be consecrated as bishop in the Episcopal Church.

During The Right Reverend Nedi Rivera's consecration, following the Church's tradition, fellow bishops gathered to lay hands on her while the ordination prayer was recited. Among them was her father, Bishop Victor Rivera (as previously stated, he was a vocal opponent of women's ordination). At a point in the ceremony, Bishop Victor Rivera vested his daughter, Bishop Nedi Rivera, with his own cope vestment. Reflecting on the moment, Bishop Nedi Rivera said, "He didn't change his mind; he changed his heart." Alleluia! Source: Wikipedia and other references.
