A MESSAGE FROM OUR BISHOP...Not since the early months of the Covid-19 pandemic have so many people in our region experienced economic uncertainty on the scale that we are witnessing now. Sharp and sudden reductions in the federal workforce, changes in federal policies and expenditures, and the determined effort to deport migrants are taking a toll on many we love and hold in our circles of concern. In an effort to respond to the immediate economic and humanitarian needs many are facing, the Episcopal Diocese of Washington has established an Emergency Relief Fund to provide direct assistance to those within our congregations and the communities they serve.
