WOODLEY HOUSE INC., TO OFFICE AT ALL SOULS APRIL 1.

Mother Sara and the Vestry are delighted to announce that Woodley House Inc., a local non-profit, will become a tenant in the first floor of the administration building starting April 1st. For nearly 70 years, Woodley House has offered a full continuum of residential care to support Washingtonians who face mental health disorders. All Souls has long supported the work of Woodley House through financial and food pantry donations. But Mother Sara saw an opportunity to deepen the relationship between our two mission-aligned organizations with the idea that All Souls could provide space for Woodley House administrative offices and Woodley House could pay All Souls a modest rent. Reacting to the newly signed lease agreement, Ann Chauvin, the CEO and Executive Director of Woodley House, said "Our Woodley Park neighbors are the best -- so warm, welcoming and generous. This neighborhood has been a huge part of our success in providing dignified housing and support services to tens of thousands of vulnerable Washingtonians over the years. To be able to expand our office in All Souls' beautiful space, while strengthening our connections with the All Souls community, we're just incredibly excited and grateful."

GOD IS AT WORK AT ALL SOULS, DC!

Sunday, December 21st, 2025, was a banner day at All Souls Episcopal Church in Washington D.C.! It was time for Bishop Mariann Budde's visit which occurs every 3 years. She led the 10 a.m. Forum in the Undercroft, asking us questions about what we find special at All Souls; she also facilitated a discussion on our Advent study book *The Spiritual Life* by Evelyn Underhill. It was wonderful for our newer parishioners to meet Bishop Mariann; she was last with us for my Installation in May 2024 as All Souls first ever female Rector, which was a joyous celebration!

Bishop Budde presided and preached at our service Holy

Eucharist, exploring the Isaiah 7 passage where God challenges King Ahaz to ask for a sign that God would faithfully accomplish God's promise; too often in our anxiety, we take matters into our own hands rather than trusting God for the outcome. Bishop Mariann confirmed Jody Koepp-Norris and Aurora Sherman, newcomers to All Souls; she also received Tara Mancini into the church.

Sadly, Julia O'Hanlon and Trevor Merrifield were sick and could not be received and confirmed that day; they will be

received and confirmed by the Bishop this May at the Cathedral. We celebrated this momentous occasion with a cake and a hearty coffee hour provided by the Vestry. Our Bishop met with the Vestry after coffee hour and was most interested in hearing about our progress and challenges. Our congregation continues to grow in numbers and spiritual commitment to God; our fastest growing demographic is the 20s and 30s group, which is stunning! God is answering our prayers for new people to keep coming and staying at All Souls.

We are thankful to have a caring and calm Bishop who listens well to her flock throughout the Diocese.
