

I am excited as we begin another church year at All



Souls on September 14th! I will have been here a year and eight months!

It is amazing to see all the answers to our persevering prayers! Last week (August 24th), 10 new people joined us for worship, totaling 71! Four from Bolivia, two from France, and two other 20's and 30's. Two people from the previous week returned and introduced themselves to me. Most of our new people stayed to enjoy our wonderful and energizing coffee hour after the service! Such joy!

Newer people are now connecting more deeply with All Souls, volunteering to serve in various capacities, such as Acolytes, Altar Guild, the Stewardship and Finance Committees. I have the largest number yet of participants in my Episcopal 101 class which begins meeting on September 10th at 6:30 pm in the Conference Room. Our Bishop Mariann Budde will join us on December 21st to baptize, confirm, reaffirm and renew our commitment to God in Christ. Please mark your calendars!

More and more people are coming to the 10 am Forums on Sundays, before the weekly services held in the Conference Room. We will kick off the new year in style with Samuel Littauer and Helen Schmedtje (both relative newcomers) being interviewed by me about their Spiritual Journeys on September 14th . Fascinating to get to know each other better and to be encouraged in our own Faith Journeys as we listen to others share their lives. Interesting future topics also!

Growth and Depth are two words that came to me as I prayed about this coming year 2026. At All Souls, we are a Christ-centered sanctuary where it is safe to ask questions and grow in our relationship with God and with one another. We long to become closer to God, the Fountain of Life, and to be intentional about developing deeper roots in the One who loves us so dearly. God longs to give us the strength, comfort and courage we need as we turn back to God in these challenging times. We will continue to reach out to our local neighbors this fall with free concerts, Hallowe'en fun and the offer of authentic community in Christ in times of isolation and fear. We are committed to making a difference with the poor and vulnerable in our city (Christ House, Woodley House, Samaritan Ministry, Capital Area Food Bank, immigrants) and around the world (Palestine, Cuba and Haiti) showing God's love in practical donations of time, talent and treasure. God has blessed us and we long to be a blessing to others.

Our 20's and 30's group and the Men's group continue to grow in numbers and in commitment to each other. Coffee hour in the Undercroft after the Sunday services is an important (and delicious!) opportunity where we can each reach out to someone we don't know yet, across differences of age and background. It is such a joy for me to work with you! Thank you for your kindness and support.




CHURCH CLEAN UP DAY | September 13, 9 AM – NOON


