#### GOD'S HEALING MINISTRY AT ALL SOULS


On the first and third Sundays of each month, we will offer Healing Prayer after Holy Eucharist in the side Mary Chapel. Two Healing Ministers, whom I have trained, will be standing there awaiting you. We are thankful to Al Muller and Lisa Watson who have served for years in this important ministry of God's love; Elizabeth Ellis, Vicky Drell, vEnessa Acham and Janelle Diller will now join Al and Lisa on the schedule.

The God of the Bible is a God of healing. In Exodus 15: 23-26, God showed Moses a piece of wood to

throw into the bitter water of Marah; immediately it became sweet and potable for God's thirsty people in the desert. God reveals here God's Name in Hebrew as YHWH (God's unpronounceable name) Ropheka: "I am the LORD who heals you." In the New Testament, Jesus' divinity is revealed in the four Gospels through His multiple healings and even raising people from the dead! Jesus fulfilled Isaiah 53:5 by His death on the cross which removed our sins and can bring healing: "By his wounds, we are healed." Peter's first letter chapter 2: 23-25 repeats this truth.

After Pentecost (Acts 2), when God poured out the Holy Spirit upon the believers gathered in the Upper Room, God gave, and continues to give, gifts (plural) of healing to God's church, to be used for God's glory and the common good: 1 Corinthians 12: 9 (see verses 4-11). After receiving Holy Communion, please go to the Mary Chapel. A Healing Minister will ask you: "For whom do you pray?" You may pray for yourself and/or someone else. They will ask your permission to lay a hand on your head as they pray for you. In these stressful and scary times we live in, please do avail yourself of this moving and caring ministry! Our Ministers are instruments of God's love and we leave the results of the prayers in God's hands. All prayer requests are confidential.

3 O Sabbath rest by Galilee! O calm of hills above, where Jesus knelt to share with Thee the silence of eternity, interpreted by love!




