#### From Collect to Collage: Theology and Art

vEnessa Acham will facilitate a brief discussion about *collect prayers*. Following the discussion, participants are invited to create *art collages* inspired by these prayers. Art materials will be provided. All are welcome to tear and tape, and to cut and paste. No prior experience is necessary!

**Collect**: a short, structured Christian prayer that summarizes the main themes of a service or a particular day's liturgy. **Collage**: an art-making technique in which a new whole is created by assembling different forms.



Composers include Dieterich Buxtehude, Johann Sebastian Bach, Cesar Franck, Leo Sowerby, and Paul Manz.


Come and hear how different composers explored this compositional device in many different ways.






## COME AND LEARN MORE ABOUT THE EPISCOPAL CHURCH, OUR BELIEFS AND PRACTICES




