WORSHIPING THE GOD OF LOVE

A Message from Mother Sara

Starting this Sunday July 13th, we will enjoy

using the words of the liturgy from Enriching our Worship, especially for some of the Holy Eucharist, the Confession and the Post-Communion Prayer. The Washington National Cathedral often uses Enriching our Worship in their services. Many of you will recognize the

prayers which we used for a while last year.

Many parts of the service will remain the same as before; we will continue using the blue Hymnal 1982 and the beige AAHH. We will change from using Form III of the Prayers of the People to Form IV for the Prayers of the People on p. 388 in the Book of Common Prayer with the refrain "Hear our prayer."

It can be helpful to use different words in our worship service from time to time so that we think more deeply about what we are saying and how we see God. I find the words of Enriching our Worship prayers to be deeply meaningful and beautiful, expressing our belief in a God who loves us so dearly, without exception.

At All Souls, we identify as being traditional in worship and progressive in our thinking. We can also be flexible, for our love of Jesus is not limited to any one form of liturgy. The tone of our worship remains consistently reverential at all times.

During the Lent and Advent seasons, we use the more traditional words of Rite I from the Book of Common Prayer. We have used Rite II for the last few months with

the more contemporary language. We will now use Enriching our Worship from July 13 until Advent begins on November 30th. This will give us all time to get used to the words so that we become comfortable saying them each week.

I will look forward to seeing you all next Sunday as we draw near in love and worship to God at the 11 am service. Thank you for being an important part of the All Souls family!

STAINED GLASS WINDOW ASSESMENT TAKING PLACE

Celebrating the "Jewel Box": All Souls Stained Glass

Did you know?

othat we at All Souls are the custodians of 36 beautiful stained glass windows, that have earned our church the nickname, "the jewel box"?

othat one of our windows was made/designed by Louis Comfort Tiffany?

othat generous parishioners recently donated funds for the restoration of some of our windows?

othat our beautiful windows are not insured for their replacement value? (only against minor, incidental damage)

othat the vestry recently approved \$3,000 to have the value of our windows appraised for replacement value, should we wish to insure them for that? (This was an unanticipated expense, for which we did not budget.)

Our insurer estimates that insuring our windows would cost \$2,000 per \$1 million of assessed valuation, adding to our annual insurance bill (which is going up regardless of whether we cover the stained glass).

♦ Contributions toward the appraisal of windows received to date are \$1800 and paid to date are \$1000. Any money raised in excess of the \$3000 appraisal fee will go into the Stained Glass Fund.


