



NEW LOCAL RULES IN EFFECT FOR 2022 SEASON

USGA RULES WILL GOVERN ALL PLAY WITH THE FOLLOWING EXCEPTIONS AND CLARIFICATIONS

- The 14-Club Limit will NOT be in effect.
- Ground Under Repair: General Areas marked with solid white paint lines are to be considered ground under repair.
- Course Boundaries: Out of bounds is defined by the line between the course side points at the ground level of the boundary fence around the perimeter of the golf course. NOTE: There is no longer a boundary on the right side of #18.
- Short Game Practice Area including the practice greens and practice bunkers left of #18 & #10 and behind #11 are to be considered ground under repair and part of the general area. Free relief is available under Rule 16.1b.
- Staked Trees and Flower Beds: The young trees identified by stakes and flower beds are no play zones. If a player's ball lies anywhere on the course other than in a penalty area and it lies on or touches one of these areas or one of these areas interferes with the player's stance or area of intended swing, the player must take free relief under Rule 16.1f.
- Immovable Obstructions near the Putting Green: If your ball lies in General Area, the player may take relief under Rule 16.1b if an immovable obstruction is on the line of play, and is:
 - Within two club-lengths of the putting green, and
 - Within two club-lengths of the ball.Exception – No Relief If Line of Play Clearly Unreasonable. There is no relief under this Local Rule if the player chooses a line of play that is clearly unreasonable.
- Sod & Sod Seams: "If a player's ball lies in or touches a seam or piece of cut turf or a seam or piece of cut turf interferes with the player's area of intended swing:
 - (a) Ball in General Area. The player may take relief under Rule 16.1b.
 - (b) Ball on Putting Green. The player may take relief under Rule 16.1d.
- Roads and Paths: All roads and paths on the course, even if not artificially surfaced, are treated as immovable obstructions from which free relief is allowed under Rule 16.1.
- Preferred Lies in Drop Zones: Preferred lies are in effect in all drop zones. The ball may be placed into play.
- Drop Zones for Penalty Areas: Drop zone on #10 may be used as an additional penalty area relief option. The drop zone is located near the three trees between the fairway and the penalty area on the south side of the pond.
- Drop Zones for Immovable Obstruction Relief: Drop zones on #2, #5, #9 must be used if player is taking relief from the parking lot or swimming pool. Player is entitled to free relief if the ball lies or may be reasonably deemed to be in the parking lot or swimming pool.
- Drop Zones for Cart Path Relief: Drop zones on #6 may be used for relief. Player has the option of taking relief from the path no nearer the hole or may use whichever of the drop zones is closer to the original ball reference point.
